The Worcester, Mass., Evening Post heads its leading article, The End of Roosevelt, and among other things says:

"Mr. Roosevelt should receive full credit for the important part he played in the success of the democratic candidates everywhere. While he was president he split the republican party in the nation, and since his 'return from Elba' in his campaign of the hundred days he has 'beaten to a frazzle' the party in his own State.

"Every candidate for whom he made especially appealing speeches has been defeated and democrats he particularly attacked have all been elected. No man in public life with in the memory of the present generation ever received such a signal personal rebuke. Judge Baldwin, whom he attacked, has been elected Governor of Connecticut. Mr. Roosevelt's personal friend, Herbert Parsons, is defeated for Congress by Jefferson M. Levy. His home Congressional representative and friend, Mr. Cocks, is beaten by Martin W. Littleton and his own election district, ordinarily republican by 150, gives a plurality of sixty to Mr. Dix."

Within the past few years a beginning was made in establishing rural delivery. Post office boxes were set up at the farmers' road gates in many districts and the carriers now receive and deliver postal matter as they pass. This, along with the extension of the free delivery system to many of the smaller towns, involved a large annual expenditure. Had this been too extensively and suddenly entered upon it might have swept away the annual surplus. As it is, by prudent and cautious extension, the rural districts have been better served than ever before and it is most gratifying to find that the Department still had last year the handsome surplus of \$743,210. From this we feel assured that further advances and improvements in the postal service will follow in due course.
