Finance

NEW YORK, Sept. 17—(AP)—The stock market whipped up a quick flurry of buying today just before the final gong. Gains on the day were general and a fair scattering of new highs for a year or longer were included in the final tally.

Aircraft manufacturing stocks had carried the burden of the advance through most of a dull and spotty session but when motor and steel issues joined the parade in the final minutes of the session sections of the list followed.

Toronto Exchange

TORONTO, Sept. 17—(CP)—Stocks turned strong in the final hour of trading today on the Toronto exchange and ended the session with gains for all four index groups. Volume was 346,000 shares.

The Massey-Harris stocks, old and new, attracted considerable attention. The old stocks finished slightly lower, the common down 1-4 and the preferred down 3-8 while the new common, trading on an "if and when issued" basis, closed at 4 3-4 and the new preferred at 11 3-4. A share of old common is exchangeable for 1-2 share of new common and the old preferred of four new preferred and three new common shares.

Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, Sept. 17—(CP)—After an uncertain trend the tone today in stock exchange trading developed backbone behind a push by industrials.

New highs were reached by General Steel Wares, Foundation and Canadian Industrial Alcohol "A." Steel of Canada jumped 1-2 and gains were picked up by Alcoa "B," Algoma Steel, Asbestos, Dominion Bridge and Dominion Tar.

LIVESTOCK

MONTREAL, Sept. 17—(CP)—There were 50 cattle fresh receipts and a few held over, 72 sheep and lambs, 227 hogs, and 125 calves for sale on Montreal livestock markets today.

Cows and bulls were about 25 cents lower. Grass calves slow, other kinds of livestock about steady. Butcher cows were \$4.50 to \$7. Medium kinds from \$5.25 to \$6.25. Canners and cutters \$3.50 to \$4.25 and common bulls \$4.25 to \$5.50. Veal calves were in good demand. Prices ranged from \$9 to \$13. Drinkers \$6.50 to \$8.50 and grassers \$5 to \$6.25, mostly \$5.25 to \$6. Good ewes and wethers were \$11 to \$11.25. Black lambs and culls were discounted \$2 per cwt. Sheep were \$3.50 to \$7.

Hogs were mostly \$14.75 for B-1 dressed, a few sales up to \$14.85 and \$11.25 off trucks delivered. Grade A drew \$1 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Sows were \$8 to \$9.50 live weight.

At Montreal, rail grade hogs \$14.20, contract deliveries \$14.40, rail grade sows number one up to 270 pounds \$10, number one over 270 pounds \$9, number two undesirable all weights \$8.

Choice steers \$9.75, good \$8.25, medium \$7.25, fair \$6, common \$5.50.

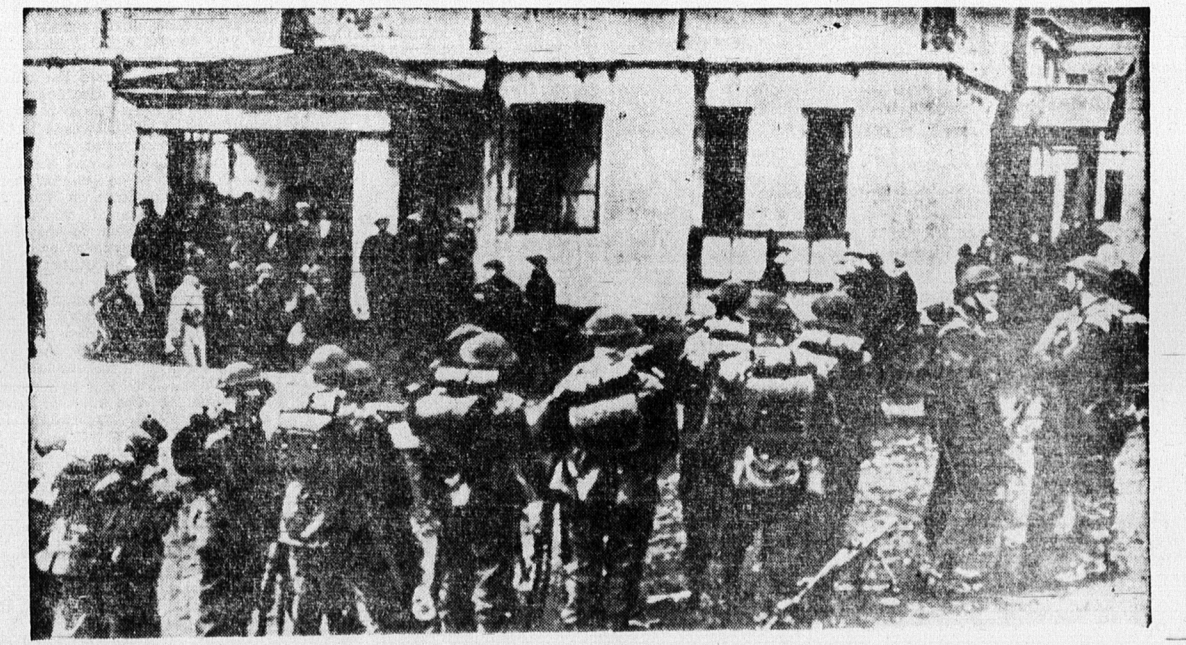

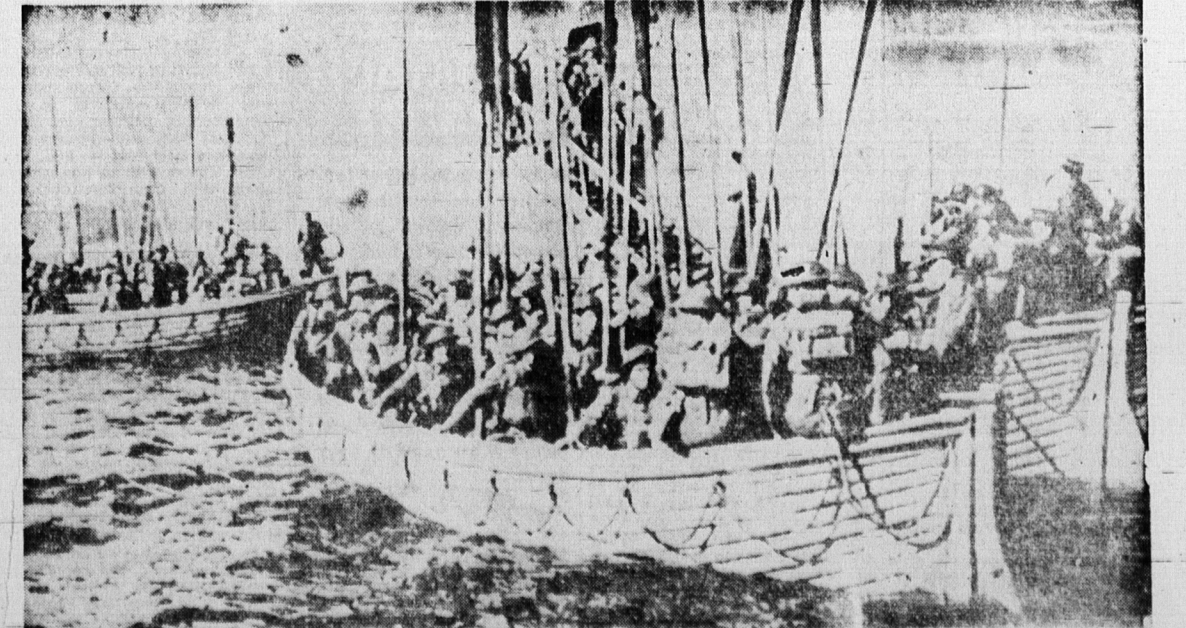

CANADA LAND FROM TROOPSHIPS, PREPARE TO SWARM ASHORE



Canadian troops, units of the expeditionary force which occupied Spitzbergen Island, in the Arctic Circle, here are seen leaving their unidentified troopship in boats preparing to land. Canadian, British and Norwegian troops shared in the occupation, successfully designed to prevent coal and oil supplies from falling into German hands. Lieut.
