land I was interested in the Frogs and found five different species and one species of Tad. I have not found the Bull-frog here as yet.

Progress? I had a party of Scottish visitors to see me, one day in Old Home Week. They were interested in Botany and we had a good time. One had been a gardener and Scottish gardeners are credited with being the best in the world. He was in favor of changing the scientific names of plants, and told me that Baudy, the great horticulturist, said that this was "a sign of progress". My answer is that in 9 cases out of 10 there is no valid reason for the change. There is an annual weed called Shepherd's-purse, which is found in every vegetable garden. It is attacked by a kind of "rust" which thickens and distorts the stem till it is snow-white in color. The early plant pathologists called this disease Cystopus candida. Then a German scientist called it Albugo candida and it went under that name till 1945, when the old name was re-established in Canadian literature! Where was the progress? The change was not necessary in the first instance.
