colleges and universities in Great Britain,
Canada and the United States, have
won for him and the institution over
which he has so long and so honorably
presided, a reputation that few have en-
joyed. As superintendent of education,
he will bring to the discharge of his duties
a knowledge of the educational needs of
the province, gained from long experience
and faithful work. Prince Edward Island
may well be proud that she has at the
head of her educational affairs a man who
has been so long identified with her
schools,—one who is possessed of excel-
lent executive ability, fine scholarly at-
tainments, and an honorable record."

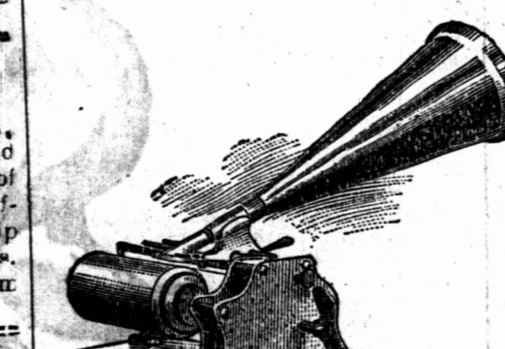
