ENGLISH AND FRENCH.

A statement was printed the other day by the Ottawa Free Press claiming to be based on the official figures of the census and showing the present French population of Canada outside of Quebec with the percentage of increase during the past ten years. It is as follows:

Ontario	1901	Increase

If we add this 340,000 to the 1,307,980 of French population in Quebec we have a total French Canadian population of 1,647,980, or just about three tenths of the entire number of people in the Dominion. But the remarkable feature of this statement is that it shows the English-speaking population of Ontario to have been stationary while in the Maritime Provinces the English-speaking population has actually declined. We know already that there was a serious decline of total numbers in Prince Edward Island, but when we take note that the French population here has made a gain of 17 per cent we see that the loss among those of other races on the island has been really very serious.

It is to be observed that while tens of thousands of immigrants have come to Canada during the decade past, very few have come to us from France or the French dependencies. The French are not a migrating people as the English, Irish, Scotch, Scandinavians, Germans and Italians are. Hence the growth of the French population in Canada has been almost wholly by natural increase—the excess of births over deaths. We must naturally rejoice over an increase of our population from whatever cause and especially by natural increase, for a native born people is always most valuable to any country. At the same time we must deplore the fact that after deducting the French Canadian increase the total growth of our English-speaking population outside of the great West is reduced to rather pitiable proportions.

It is highly gratifying to learn from the letter of Mr. Robert Jenkins which we print this morning that his neighbors and friends have contributed about \$1,000 in money and value toward making good a part of his recent heavy loss by fire. This is the more creditable to the donors from its being entirely unsolicited and unexpected on Mr. Jenkins' part. His loss will still be heavy notwithstanding the generous aid referred to.

Hon. D. A. McKinnon has communicated with members of the Dominion Government suggesting that the Marconi system of wireless telegraphy may be tried at the Cape, now that the Anglo-American cable is disabled. Yesterday he took profits of 25,000, bale to-day sold part of his hold which he bought below 7½c. pound, a bove 8c.
