C's have the A. A. A. grounds in the afternoon.

The Columbian Society of St. Dunstan's College held their first meeting of this collegiate year Sunday. The usual business of reorganization meeting was transacted. The following officers were elected for the ensuing year: President—E. V. Crowley; Vice-Pres—E. P. Curley; Secretary—Francis McDonald; Executive Com—J. E. Gillis, T. H. Greene, W. E. McDonald. The American students present this year number upwards of twenty, and they are all representatives, well and true of the flourishing Republic.

By the resignation of Rev. Dr. Campbell as district secretary for the eastern provinces, the Canadian Bible Society has lost the services of a very capable and successful representative. The following appreciative notice of Dr. Campbell appeared in the Bible in the World for September: "Dr. Campbell was the first district secretary to be appointed to District 1 by the Canadian Bible Society, and his endeavors to consolidate the organization have been so successful as to make his resignation a source of sorrow to the society. He takes with him to his new sphere the cordial good wishes of his former colleagues." By appointment of the Canadian Bible Society the succession has been taken up by the Rev. A. F. Newcomb, also an eastern province man. Mr. Newcomb enters upon his duties with the hearty confidence of all who knew him. He will soon become known to all the branches.—St. John Ex. (Rev. Dr. Campbell is well known here.)

The annual convention of the Church of Disciples of Christ of the Maritime Provinces was closed Sunday evening with a very helpful Mizpah service in which many delegates testified to the inspiration received during the four days' conference at the Douglas avenue Christian church. The services yesterday began as early as 7.30 o'clock in the morning with a prayer service led by J. Barry Allen of Fredericton, followed by the morning service with a brilliant sermon on Abundant Life, by Rev. W. F. Chase of Halifax. The ordinance of the Lord's Supper was then administered. In the afternoon a very successful mission band rally was held, addressed by Mrs. Gillis and Rev. H. R. Bell, Summerside. The evening service was very largely attended, and Rev. Mr. Minnick's able sermon was closely followed. Saturday's session was largely devoted to business matters. In the morning the home mission board report was received, showing receipts of \$1,040 and expenditure of \$922.95. Rev. John P. Floyd, Charlottetown, in explanation of resolution passed by P. E. Island Convention, made a vigorous attack on the editorial management of their paper, the Christian. He objected to the amount of reprint matter used and the lack of news of the church affairs. He urged that the paper should give more attention to the exposition of the church doctrine. Rev. J. C. Appel's resignation as editor was accepted and the choice of a successor was left with the board. A grant of \$30 towards the paper's funds was made. The officers were chosen as follows: Rev. O. B. Emery, Milltown (N. S.), president, G. F. Barnes, St. John, vice-president, and J. S. Flaglor, St. John, secretary-treasurer. Advisory committee—L. A. Miles, Halifax; L. A. Outhouse, Tiverton (N. S.); E. A. Coates and J. W. Barnes, St. John.—(A number of delegates attended the convention from the city and province.)
