M. S. DOMINION VICTIM OF ILL LUCK

Particulars of the Unfortunate Accident Which Happened to the Big Battleship on Her Way to Quebec... Capt. Ordered Hands to Dance to Liven the Ship.

QUEBEC, Sept. 3.—The accident to H. M. S. Dominion when coming to Quebec, has been proved, on a thorough investigation, to be a case of bad luck, which might have befallen under similar circumstances ninety-nine expert commanders out of every hundred at sea. The Dominion was cautiously feeling her way in the Bay des Chaleurs towards Quebec at the time, and the officer of the watch, the navigation officer, had the chart under his observation when the mishap occurred.

The King's regulations were carried out to the letter. The lead was hoisted at regular intervals and every precaution taken for the ship's safety. The lead showed that the ship was sailing in a shallow depth of water in accordance with the markings on the chart up to the last moment when the accident occurred. Notwithstanding the big fire on the land no small of smoke could be perceived on board the ship. The wind was blowing north at the time, the night was dark but clear, and the smoke was so influenced by the wind that it not only entirely obscured the Pasphebe light, but a village of considerable size that is located close by the Souris light. Both the lights mentioned are steady, and if they had been revolving or occulting lights, the accident might not have occurred. The vessel suddenly touched a hidden reef, and the shock was so great that the huge battleship shook from stem to stern.

There was no time for consultation, the navigation officer realized his mistake in an instant, and immediately had the engines reversed to full speed, and the crew summoned to quarters. Captain Kingsmill was below, eating his dinner at the time, though it was five minutes at 9 o'clock, and he lost no time in reaching the bridge, and taking command of his ship. The crew numbering 80 officers and men, were ordered to keep the ship afloat, so that her keel could not settle on the ledge. The lead showed her forward part to 27 feet of water while the vessel was drawing 28 feet. The officers and crew were told to assemble with their kit's in their hands in the forecabin, and together dance in order to keep the ship afloat. At first the men commenced to whistle until the ship's band by orders of Captain Kingsmill were assembled and furnished the music for the men to dance.

There was no distinction of rank, Captain King-mill alone stood on the bridge, and the balance of the ship's complement were engaged in dancing. The sight was a weird one, and every man was just as anxious as the commander for the safety of the ship. This continued for some time, until finally with the violent work of the screws the battleship by degrees commenced to loosen its hold on the ledge and finally gave way and backed again into deep water.

Captain Kingsmill as soon as daylight made its appearance sent the ship's div-

ers down under water to make a thorough examination, when they reported that the outer skin was damaged, and some of the rivets started, which caused the water to force its way into the ship, but otherwise the bottom was sea-worthy and the vessel could proceed. Captain Kingsmill then gave orders to continue on to Quebec slowly and cautiously, and on reaching Dieppe the ship's bottom was again examined by the divers, and the same report made, when the ship proceeded to Quebec, where her condition was thoroughly investigated by the ship's divers. In the meantime one of the ship's pumps was sufficient to keep the water under control.

The Dominion remained in the port of Quebec to fulfil all its engagements and the exact nature of the accident was never made known to the public, in fact it is questionable if the story of the accident would have leaked out as it did if the official in charge of the Halifax docks had not communicated his suspicions to the Nova Scotia press on the receipt of an inquiry made to him in reference to those docks if they should be required. It is said when Captain Kingsmill reported the accident to the Admiral with all its surrounding circumstances, he was ordered to proceed to Bermuda and there have the ship repaired in the naval dock for survey and repair.
