BY WAY OF REMEMBRANCE.

In order that there shall be no misunderstanding as to the political future of the province we reproduce for the information of the public generally the salient points in the platform of the Liberal party, the promises upon the expected fulfilment of which they received their mandate from the people. This platform was promulgated in the Legislature on May 14th last in a resolution moved by Mr. J. H. Bell, Leader of the then Opposition and seconded by Mr. A. E. McLean. It is not necessary to reproduce the text of the whole resolution as many of the planks had already been adopted or were being acted upon by the Arsenault Government and therefore may be regarded as policies upon which the two parties were practically in agreement. Following are the distinctive Liberal promises which, evidently, the people believed would be carried out to the letter and to the carrying out of which they are now looking forward:

1. "All our claims at Ottawa (including that for a share of western school lands) to be immediately presented and pressed."
2. "The War and Health Tax to be abolished." This is explicit, and requires no comment.
- 3, 4 and 5 include votes for women, vote by ballot and more economical administration of Falconwood.
6. "Education. Salaries to be AT ONCE raised to a fair living wage. Better normal training, greater emphasis on home projects. School fairs and elementary education for the masses."
7. The first promise is specific, "salaries to be AT ONCE raised." This requires no comment, those following are general, the last very much so.
- 8, 9 and 10 are general and can be interpreted to suit any occasion or any action on the part of the government.
11. "Returned Soldiers. All of whatever vocation, to receive generous and EQUAL financial assistance."

This also is specific and was so interpreted by at least some of the candidates, the "equal financial assistance" promised being \$2,000 cash to each soldier who fought overseas, \$1,500 to those who got no farther than England, and \$1,000 to those who did not leave Canada.

12. This deals with Prohibition and means anything to suit either prohibitionist or anti-prohibitionist.

13. "Revenue and expenditure to meet," presumably without increase of taxation and with the War and Health Tax abolished.

This is the program, clear and explicit, these the promises which the people on election day believed would be sacredly kept by the Liberal candidates to whom they gave their support and who, because of these promises and this support have been entrusted with the government.

As politicians, lay and professional, are proverbially forgetful, we would suggest that this platform be preserved for future reference.

WHY?

The greatest military triumph in the whole world's history has just been achieved and the world is settling down, or trying to settle down, to the enjoyment of the dawning of peace after the long and troubled night of war. The Allied nations which for nearly five years stood shoulder to shoulder which suffered and sacrificed together, which encouraged and buoyed each other up, which ungrudgingly shed their heart's blood and poured out their treasure for each other and which rejoiced together in their mutual triumph, are now, each in its own way, entering upon the avocations of peace. And how? In France Premier Clemenceau, the beloved "Tiger" is being fiercely assailed by a political faction; in England, the government of Lloyd George, the acknowledged saviour of the British Empire, is being criticized and threatened with destruction; in Canada Premier Borden and the men, Liberals and Conservatives, who stood around him through the storm and who brought Canada safely through the only real crisis in its history, are being similarly criticized.

A curious circumstance in this connection is that while each of these Powers is being consumed by internal criticism of the most venomous kind, each is extolling the other for its wonderful achievements in the war.

The names of Lloyd George, Premier Clemenceau and Borden will be written large in the future history of their respective nations and of the world, but in the meantime and just on the accomplishment of their great task they are the prey of those who, for some reason or other, failed in their own immediate objective, whether material emolument or distinction.

Why is this? History tells us that similar psychological phenomena followed every great war in history. Are we to admit that the voice of the disgruntled and the disappointed is more potent than that of the grateful and the conscientious? Is ingratitude the ruling passion?

BATTERY RUNS DOWN PERIODICALLY

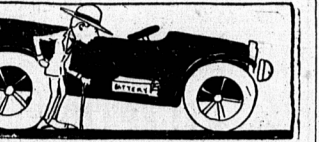


D. W. P. writes: I have a car with battery ignition, which will run well for a time, until the battery runs down and I have to send it away to be recharged. The garage experts tell me that there is no short-circuit in the wiring. What do you think is the trouble? Am I thinking of selling the car, although I cannot afford the inevitable loss.

Answer: With the installation on this car, leaving the ignition switch "on" when the engine is not running, very soon completely discharges the battery and the directions are "never to leave the switch key in the switch when the engine is shut down." Probably, this warning has occasionally been disregarded and some meddlesome person has thrown a switch. We doubt if there is any short-circuit, for if there were, the electric system would not properly as you say it does, at times. There is a form of automatic switch upon the market which opens the circuit when it has accidentally been left closed and perhaps you can install one of these. If your car is satisfactory in other respects you better keep it, as the electrical difficulty can be overcome.

REPLACING BATTERY IGNITION BY MAGNETO

M. writes: I am about to buy a new car and find that nearly every make sold at the price I wish to pay, is fitted with battery ignition. I live 30 miles from a repair shop, I fear that I should be troubled by the battery running down, if I bought one of these cars with no magneto. Can magnetos be substituted on these cars?



Answer: Most magneto to manufacturers have replacement fittings, by the use of which their magnetos can be substituted for battery ignition, upon most popular makes of cars and, considering your remote situation, the fitting of a magneto would seem advisable. You can probably have this done at the car factory, by paying an additional price. If you do not wish to incur this extra expense, you can protect yourself against failure of ignition due to storage battery exhaustion, by carrying a set of five dry cells to use for supplying ignition current, in such an emergency. Any electrician can tell you how to connect these cells, so that you can start the engine by hand-cranking.
