Rookie Gives Red Wings 1-0 Victory Over Hawks; Amerks Blank Rangers 1-0

NEW YORK, Jan. 26 (CP)—New York Americans climbed into a second place tie with Rangers tonight as Earl Robertson scored them a 1-0 victory over their intra-city National Hockey League rivals. Tommy Anderson got the winning goal.

A crowd of 10,683 saw the game. The victory aside from putting the Amerks in a second place tie with the Rangers in the League and setting Boston Bruins, also drew them level with the Rangers in the city series, both having two wins and a draw to their credit in five intra-city tilts this season.

The American's goal came on a power play, Anderson, their star scorer, taking an assist on the net. Szwarc close in, and gofing the puck past, Goalie Kerr. Schirmer who helped set up the assault also drew attention behind the play which occurred while Murray Patrick was in the penalty box.

Bob Pastor Regarded Likely Opponent For Joe Louis In March

(By Sid Feder, Associated Press Sports Writer) NEW YORK, Jan. 26—Although the latest victim of Joe Louis' sleeping potions hadn't yet come out of the "ether," Promoter Mike Jacobs and the Brown Bomber's brain trust went into a huddle today to decide the next test fight to set before the heavyweight king.

They arrived at no definite conclusion about an indoor fight in Madison Square Garden in March, Mike explaining it would take a couple of days to straighten out details, but it was learned the only hitch in the negotiations was over the selection of an opponent.

In this respect, now that John Henry Lewis is out of the way as a result of the two minutes, 49 seconds it took joining Joe to flatten him last night, the only heavyweight rated as a contender is a shot at hitting Joe were Maxie Baer, Lou Nova, Tony Galento and Bob Pastor.

Likely Candidate Since Baer and Nova already are matched for May 22 inasmuch as a Galento-Louis bout is a natural for outdoors, Pastor is considered the most likely possibility for the indoor crack in March.

If Mike and Louis' managerial staff become convinced such a return match—Pastor went the 10-round route with Joe two years ago—would attract another \$100,000 house, you can just about bet the family meal ticket it will be made.

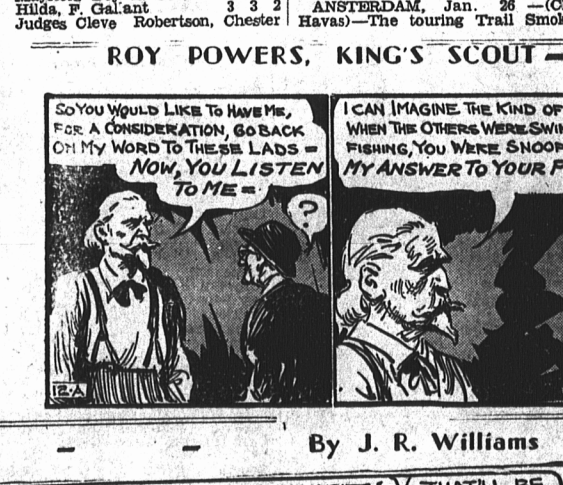
