Notice Re Intoxicated Drivers

The Highway Traffic Act of 1936 provides that any person convicted of driving, or being in charge of, a motor vehicle while intoxicated shall have his operator's license cancelled for a period of at least a year.

The Legislature has therefore taken away all discretion to reinstate licenses which have been cancelled for intoxicated driving, and no applications for such reinstatement can be considered under any circumstances.

In Memoriam MR. JAMES HARRIS The death of Mr. James Harris, a former resident of Roseville, P. E. I., occurred at Port Coquitlam, B. C., on May 7th. Mr. Harris was born in Three Rivers, P. Q., but while still a young child removed with his parents to Prince Edward Island, where he lived until 1930. In that year, he went to Murrayville, B. C., where he lived with his parents and his wife, Mrs. Agnes Harris, until 1937. During the past year he had resided at Port Coquitlam, B. C., with another daughter, Mrs. Duncan MacLaren, at whose home he passed away at the age of ninety-two years.

Mr. Harris was ordained an elder in the Presbyterian Church in 1888 and for many years was active in Church and Sunday School work. He was a highly respected farmer and a successful business man. He was affectionately remembered by many friends there, as well as in Cardigan, Roseville, and other places in the vicinity. His kindness of spirit endeared him to all who knew him. Wool Wool Wool The Prince Edward Island Sheep Breeders' Association again offers its services in assembling the wool clip of the Province for co-operative marketing through the Canadian Co-operative Wool Growers, Limited, Toronto.

Last year the volume of wool marketed in this way from this Province more than doubled that of the previous year. This fact indicated confidence in this medium of marketing and complete satisfaction with the prices secured. The Association set the price at the full market level and compelled competing agencies to raise prices to this level. This year, wool prices are low, and farmers may sell outright to the first buyer at a low prevailing price. Sheepmen should take note of this fact, however, that when you sell your wool through the Canadian Co-operative Wool Growers, you not only receive promptly in cash, at time of delivery, the highest prevailing market price, but also the rise in the market until the wool is ultimately sold through an expert sales service at the most favorable periods of distribution. This rise in price will come to the wool patron at a later date.

This year wool will be received after June 10th and the week commencing June 13th will be the Big Wool Week in Prince Edward Island. Our agents will receive wool at various points in the Province at this time. Do not sell or ship your product until you contact for full particulars, prices, etc.
