Allies To Stand Firmly Together

(Special To The Guardian)

PARIS, Jan. 28.—The question of German reparations is again in the hands of a committee of experts. This committee, which was appointed after a prolonged discussion by the Supreme Council yesterday afternoon were to consider certain details and reports to the Council before a final decision is taken. The discussion on reparations was taken up in the afternoon in an atmosphere made quite unfavorable by the radical position assumed yesterday by M. Doumer, French Minister of Finance, who named \$12,000,000,000 gold marks as the total amount of indemnity Germany should pay.

The British Prime Minister is understood to have clearly indicated the radical demands made by the Doumer as impossible of realization.

Premier Lloyd George took up the whole question of reparations at the opening session of the Supreme Council. He declared there was no difference of opinion regarding the merits of the problem. "Germany must pay to her utmost capacity, and in order to assure this the Allies must stand together."

M. P. B. A. A. U. of Canada President Tells Why "Big" Larry McLean Was Reinstated

A. W. Covey, president of the M. P. B. A. A. U. of Canada, was in Halifax last night and will leave today for St. John. When asked why "Big" Larry McLean, the Fredericton hockey star, was reinstated, Covey explained the matter fully. It appears that McLean who was an amateur previous to 1911, was sent to Quebec at the expense of a Sydney man, and that McLean did not receive one cent in salary from the Ancient Capitol moguls. He produced affidavits signed by Sydney and Quebec men which were forwarded to the president of the Canadian Amateur Athletic Union. A week ago, Chairman C. C. Robinson of the C. A. A. U. sent word to President Covey that McLean's request for reinstatement had been granted. Covey says that the case was fully investigated and that the authorities took the proposed steps as McLean had only a tryout with Quebec. President Covey is pleased with the situation down east and states that already over 500 new amateur cards have been issued and matters are beginning to return to normal. While in Halifax President Covey talked about baseball and is endeavoring to ascertain what the province will have for next season. He plans to hold a big meeting of the maritime athletic men, at Truro early in April when matters will be straightened out for 1921.
