(Received over Pitfield and Co's Private Wire) NEW YORK, Dec. 7.—The London market is quiet again today. International issues slightly firmer. Domestically, there is very little news. The Supreme Court convened today and it is possible there may be some important decisions handed down. Dividend meetings today are American Crystal Sugar, Endicott Johnson and National Steel. We would expect an irregular market again today and would look for the oils to do better. In the low priced oils Ohio looks higher.

TORONTO, Dec. 7.—Oklend—Will begin drilling early in Jan-

uary. Madsen Red Lake—is to hold a meeting today to vote on the question of an increase of capital from 3,000,000 to 5,000,000 shares. The object is too find ways and means through which funds may be secured with which to deal with the very large tonnage indicated. Strong financial interests are understood to be offering to supply funds. Laguna—in Manitoba has an average grade of \$22 to the ton and is operating a plant of 70 tons per day. However, production is indicated to have hit a new record of about \$38,000. Preston East Dome—The shaft has reached its immediate objective of 20 feet and a station is now being cut.

MINING

TORONTO, Dec. 7.—(CP)—The Toronto mining section had a day of moderate declines in all groups on less than the normal volume of trade among the secondary and higher price issues. Heavy action in a few of the penny stocks swelled the volume however to 1,226,000 shares. The gold index lost a little more than a half point and the miscellaneous mines index nearly two points.

O'Brien pushed up to a new high at 14 but profit-taking carried the quotation back to 12 1-2 for a net loss of 1-8.

A few golds held early gains. Dome closed 3-4 of a point up. Darkwater 7 cents up and Central Patricia, Coniarum, East Malartic, Macassa, Red Lake Gold Shore, Teck Hughes and Toburn added 3 to 5 cents each.

Lake Shore with a loss of 1 1-4 was prominent on the down side. Wright Hargreaves, Little Long Lac and Pickle Crow weakened 15 each and losses of 5 to 10 were marked up for MacLeod-Cockshutt, Argosy Bidgood-Kirkland, Cariboo, Chibougamau, Moneta, Pamour, Read Antlier, San Antonio, Sladen, Sylvanite and Towagmac.
