A N ODORLESS DISINFECTANT.

So many object to the odor of carbolic acid that the following simple formula for an odorless disinfectant for the plumbing may be of interest: Dissolve half a pound of permanganate of potash in four gallons of water and pour this carefully down the pipes. This solution, when allowed to stand in bowls or basins stains them purple. The stains may be removed with a weak solution of oxalic acid. The acid must be rinsed off immediately after it has been used.
