\$55,000 in Prizes for Cyclists.

Bicycle racing will be one of the features of the Paris Exposition next year. As the world's championships will take place in the French Capital during the world's fair, riders from almost every civilized country on the globe will compete.

The aggregate value of the purses offered for the various events is \$55,000, a greater sum than has ever before been hung up at a bicycle meet.

During the latter part of August and early in September the main cycle events of the exposition will be decided. The Grand Prize of Paris and the U. V. F. races will take place in June and July.

The Grand prize of the exposition, which will be open to the world, will probably take place on September 8. It will be at 2,000 metres (2,187 yards), with prizes amounting to \$6,000.

The grand prize of the exposition, for amateurs, will take place on September 10. The prizes in this race will amount in value to \$800. The trial heats will only be run on this day, as a hundred-mile paced race, with a \$2,000 purse, will be featured.

Telegraphing Through Walls.

CHICAGO, Nov. 27.—Prof. W. S. Johnson and C. L. Frontier, of Milwaukee, to-day made a successful test in this city of wireless telegraphy. They succeeded in telegraphing without wires through a suite of seven rooms, with all doors closed, and through seven walls. Another test was made when the signals were conveyed through three fireproof vaults, and an ordinary telegraph switchboard in which 30 wires were coiled up and about 40 dead wires were located. A third test was made in which the sending instrument was placed inside one of the steel vaults, and both doors were closed and the combination lock turned. The signals were then transmitted clearly from the inside of the vault to an adjoining room. The professor claims that his invention is materially different from that of Marconi's, and that instruments can be constructed to be carried on horseback and be ready for operation within a few minutes.

The Gossip Of The Sporting World.

When Karl Crasmanu arrived at the Oriental Hotel, Vancouver, B. C., on Nov. 1st, his eyelometer registered 5320 miles.

ANOTHER FEW RECORDS
Kansas City, Mo., Nov. 27.—Repine, of Nashville, wins the 48 hour bicycle race. Final score at 4.30—Repine, 961 miles 4 laps; Julius, 961 3 laps; Miller, 961 miles 3 laps; Lawson, 960 miles 1 lap; Waller, 960 mile 7 laps.

Repine established a new record for 48 hours. The distance covered is 87 1-6 miles better than the previous record for a similar contest.

Repine will realize \$400 and several special prizes; Julius gets \$250; Miller \$150; Lawson \$100; Lingenfelder \$75, and Neiderhofer \$25.

Li Hung Chang's New Post.

Berlin, Nov. 25.—A despatch from Peking announces that an Imperial decree has been issued appointing Li Hung Chang Minister of Commerce.

Peking, Nov. 26.—Li Hung Chang's appointment as Minister of Commerce, already cabled, is regarded as distinctly a step in the right direction, and as likely to tend to improve greatly foreign commercial relations with China.

M. Pichon, French Minister to China, has demanded the execution of the official responsible for the recent murder of the two French officers at Montao, together with a small indemnity, which the Chinese will probably gladly pay.

Young Shurlock A Shot.

LONDON, Nov. 26.—In a letter received at his home, written on the eve of the battle of Elandslange, the 16-year-old trumpeter, Shurlock, of the Fifth Royal Irish Lancers who shot three Boers, shows that he lived up to his word. "All the other boys," wrote Shurlock, "were left behind at Pietermaritzburg. I am just enjoying myself all right here. I went to revolver practice the other day. The sergeant-major said, 'Very good for the first time, and I bet I will shoot some of the Boers down if I get the least chance.'"

Hobart's Heir's are Rich.

PATERSON, N. J., Nov. 27.—The companies holding risks on the life of Vice-President Hobart to-day sent his executors their cheques for the amount of the policies. The Equitable Life Assurance Society had \$100,000, and the New York Life Insurance had \$55,000.

The Lakes of Killarney.

London, Nov. 27.—Lord Ardilaun (Arthur Edward Guinness) has purchased the Muckross estate for \$300,000. The Muckross estate includes the lakes of Killarney. Advice yesterday said the estate had been bought by Baron Iveagh, a nephew of Ardilaun.
