It would seem that in the red tape of military officialdom between our headquarters in Canada, and that in the Old Country it takes some time to work this through in order that they may come without friction, and with little patience, when the thing is properly started, we can afford to look for the desired results.

GENERAL MEWBURN'S LETTER.

Dear Senator Murphy:—

I have your letter of the 9th. inst. enclosing a clipping regarding the proposed arrangement that men returning from Overseas may take their discharge in the East, and within a month of the date of their discharge obtain transportation at public expense to the point of enlistment.

I am glad that you advised those interested in your locality of the steps being taken to this end. I may say, however, that the matter is still a subject of cables with the Overseas Authorities, and all the details have not yet been worked out. I have no doubt that a final decision will be arrived at within a short time.
