The Winnipeg Telegram of the 4th inst. tells of the successes of a former P. E. Island boy, H. Auld, in the recent Provincial Rifle match held there. He won the "Hudson Bay Co's" match, seven shots at six hundred yards, with a possible in a bad fish-tail wind, his being the only possible on the range. Second place in the "Taylor Match," seven shots and five hundred yards under active service conditions; second place in the "All Corner's Aggregate" being one point behind Lt. Blackburn of Bisley fame who won; besides a cup, a medal and money prizes. Another P. E. Islander shooting well up in the aggregate is A. C. Lawson. Both Lawson and Auld formerly belong to E. Co., 82nd B.T.I.

Temple, \$3,100 in city debentures and other securities. The date of the will was May 31, 1910. The personal property and household furniture is to be divided among the children.

A groom was cast over the entire town when it became known that Reginald C. Nash had died in Aberdeen Hospital, New Glasgow, N. S. For some time back his health had been impaired but he had sufficiently recovered to resume work and having a strong constitution his friends thought he had been fully restored to his normal condition. For a time he seemed to rally but very soon complications set in and temperature arose and he rapidly grew worse. After considerable suffering the end came at 9:30 on the morning of Aug. 5th. He was attended in his death by the Rev. Dr. McVicar, and was buried with Masonic Honors on Saturday afternoon at 4 o'clock. The services were conducted by Rev. A. McLean Sinclair, of Hopewell. Deepest sympathy is felt for his widow who was formerly Miss Janie Gillis, of Belfast, P. E. Island.
