**The Experts Say**

OTTAWA, April 20 (CP)—At no time of the year is the housewife's problem more difficult than in the early spring when stored vegetables are past their best and the fresh garden produce is not ready. Canned vegetables are the answer.

"Sometimes canned vegetables may be served just as they come from the tin. On other occasions it is better to strain them by combining them with sauces or other foods. When canned vegetables are prepared for serving, the liquid should never be thrown away as it contains much of the flavor. Drain the liquid into a saucepan and boil rapidly until it is reduced to about half a cup. Add the vegetable, heat, season and serve."

Vegetables which may seem flat without the customary melted butter can be pepped up with a pungent sauce like this one, suggested by the home economist of the Nutrition Department Consumer Section—green beans in mustard sauce. The recipe requires one tablespoon of fat, two tablespoons of flour, two teaspoons of sugar, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 1-2 teaspoon vinegar, one can of green beans (10 oz) containing 2 1/2 cups, 1-2 teaspoon of minced onion.

Melt the fat, add the flour and sugar, salt and mustard. Blend with the vegetables, slowly stir in the liquid drained from the beans. Cook over low heat until thickened, stirring constantly. Add the onion, salt and vinegar; continue cooking until beans are thoroughly heated. Serve hot. This recipe makes six servings. These spicy beans may also be cooked and served as a relish.

There were no loss of nutrients in preparation, the Nutrition Division estimates the lowly potato in its contribution of ascorbic acid (vitamin C) and would rank third for thiamin (vitamin B1), nicotinic acid (niacin), iron and carbohydrates.

Unfortunately, the common method of cooking potatoes in this country cut down its contribution in amazing proportions. Ascorbic acid, thiamin, niacin and iron are all water soluble and all, except iron, are affected by heat. Ascorbic acid is especially rapidly destroyed by heat in the presence of air.

The Nutrition Division suggests this method of cooking potatoes in order to save as much of the root value as possible: Scrub potatoes thoroughly and cook in their skins, with variety do not do so until you are ready to cook them; cook only in the number required for one meal; when boiling use only the amount of water necessary to prevent burning; add salt to the water at the start of cooking to help preserve vitamin C; place potatoes in boiling water and keep well covered; avoid serving mashed potatoes since mashing incorporates air, decreasing the vitamin C value. However, if you must mash them, serve them promptly; potatoes, steamed or baked in their skins, will not allow loss of vitamins as the cooking should not be unnecessarily prolonged.

**Variety Meats**

May Be Savory

Liver is probably the best known of all the "variety meats." Its distinctive flavour can be utilized to advantage by combining with other foods, such as bacon, mushrooms, tomatoes, onions and other vegetables. It is not necessary to scald liver before cooking, but for grinding or chopping, scalded liver is easier to handle. Liver is usually broiled or pan-fried. To retain its distinctive flavour, do not overcook.

Swerveheads and brains are spoken of in the same breath, since they are prepared in similar ways. They are pre-cooked in salted water, to which vinegar has been added to give a firm texture. They are both exceptionally good creamed, scrambled with eggs or served in a salad.

Since heart and tongue are less tender than the other "variety meats" they require slow cooking, using moist heat. A large beef heart will require four hours cooking and will serve 10-12 persons. A lamb heart makes a generous individual serving, a veal heart two and a pork heart one to two persons.

**Calves Tongues**  
 Four cups water, 23 stalks of celery with leaves, 1 onion, sliced, 2 carrots, 1 bay leaf, 6-8 peppercorns, 1 1/2 teaspoons salt, 1 tablespoon vinegar, 3 calves tongues. Boil together for three minutes.

the water celery, onion, carrots, bay leaf, peppercorns, salt and vinegar. Lower temperature to simmering and add calves tongues. Continue to simmer until tongues are tender, about 1 1/2 hours. Remove the skin. Drain stock and thicken with flour, which has been mixed to a smooth paste in cold water. Season with salt and pepper and one teaspoon grated horseradish. Six servings.
