TRANS-CONTINENTAL RAILWAYS.

It is evident that in connection with the two new projected railways to the Pacific our public men will shortly have a very urgent and important question to consider—that of Government aid to these enterprises. There is room enough for these roads, and so far is an outlet from our great wheatfields to the eastward is concerned, it may be admitted that the new roads will be needed within a few years to come. But to build two new railways from the prairie country to the Pacific there is no present necessity and little prospect of its arising in the near future. One, or at most two railways can easily carry the passenger and freight traffic which will seek our Pacific ports as an outlet for years to come.

And it must be observed that while the promoters of the new ventures would doubtless like to obtain liberal subsidies in money and lands, such as were granted to the Canadian Pacific, they can have no

such claims as that regard as existed in the case of the pioneer road. Before the Canadian Pacific was built, Manitoba, the Northwest and British Columbia had not even a decent road for connection between themselves and the other Provinces of Canada. The construction of a railway connection on Canadian soil was a condition of the union with British Columbia, so that without it the union of all British North America under one government would have been impossible. There were national considerations behind the pioneer road and national advantages have followed its construction. Distant Provinces were connected, a great national highway was created where there was none before, and Canadian commerce, because of this has stretched out across the far Pacific to Australia, China and Japan.

The influx of population to Manitoba and the North west, the magnificent harvests that are now produced there, the enormous increase in the value of lands, and to a large extent the opening up of the great mineral resources of British Columbia were due to the Canadian Pacific. In the light of these splendid results and in view of the fact that the road had to be built when our great West was unknown and unpopulated, when in all Canada west of Ontario there were not 200,000 white people, and when few had any faith that a railway once built could be maintained in operation, it is clear that liberal grants of both money and lands were justifiable. But the merest glance at the conditions existing then and those existing now will sufficiently show that no new railway to the Pacific has or can have any such claim upon the country as those which pertained to the first Pacific railway enterprise.

In taking this ground we are not taking ground against moderate assistance by the Government to the new trans-continental railway ventures. But we believe the time is near when subsidies to railways must be greatly restricted if not wholly abolished. Governments federal and provincial have done their full share in making the fortunes of contractors and speculators in railway charters, sometimes with very little advantage to the country while always adding to the national debt. The new conditions of our Great West must be carefully considered. Much of the land in that country is already locked up by railway and land companies and speculating syndicates. It would be a misfortune if further large government grants to new railway companies should place further barriers between the land and the actual settlers.

THE CARDIGAN MEETING

A large and influential meeting of electors of the Cardigan District was held at Montague on Monday night. It was addressed by the two candidates, Nathaniel McLaren, Government, and W. A. O. Morson, K. C., opposition, Premier Peters, M. L. A., A. A. McLean, K. C., J. J. Hughes, M. P., J. A. Matheson, Hon. J. F. Whelan, Mardock McKinnon, M. L. A. and Senator Robertson.

in its recital showed that the Company are issuing thirty year bonds for \$150,000 bearing interest at 6 per cent. "The said bonds to contain a clause providing for the exchange thereof at any time within twelve months from the date of issue of said bonds for other bonds of temporary bearing interest at not less than 4 per cent per annum, payment of both principal and interest there of being guaranteed by the Province of Prince Edward Island, or for other bonds of the said Province of Prince Edward Island, the rate of the maturity of said Government bonds to be the same as the date of the said just named bonds."

Premier Peters in his reply took very different ground from that taken by him at Marshfield and similar to his attitude at the Board of Trade meeting in this City. This affords conclusive evidence that if the Company fulfil the prescribed conditions their bonds for \$150,000 will be guaranteed by the Government.

The Prior Ministry in British Columbia is of a non-partisan character, being made up of three Liberals and four Conservatives. Joe Martin, not being in the Cabinet is naturally in opposition to it, but not all the Opposition accept Mr Martin's leadership.

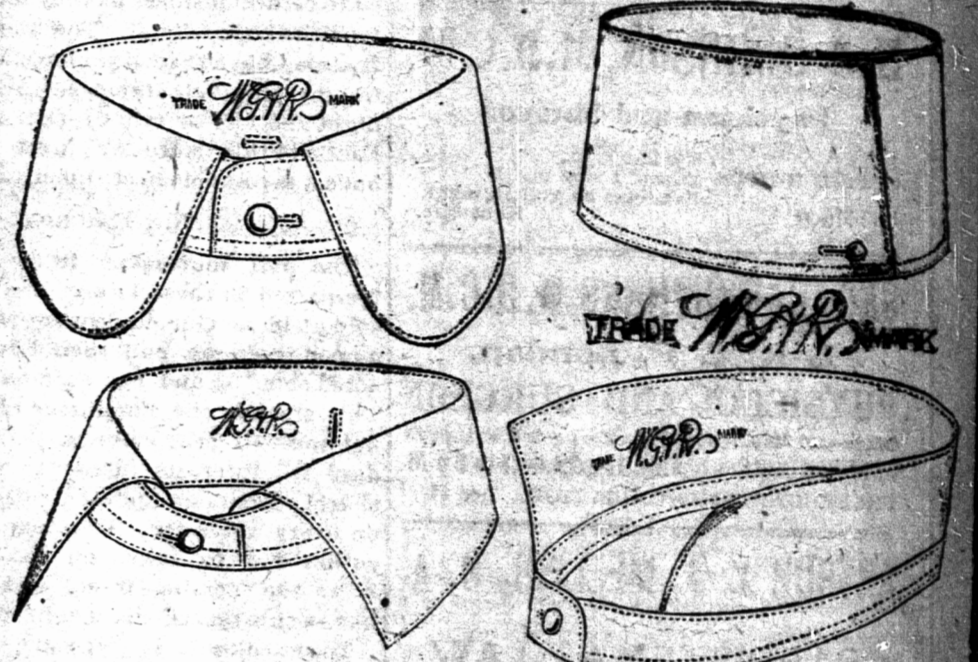
