ABDIED IN CAPTURE OF DIAMOND THIEVES—According to word received recently from Holland Orl. J. L. Mackinnon, son of Mr. F. M. Mackinnon, Hillsboro St., was among a group of Canadian personnel responsible for the arrest of an armed international gang of diamond thieves. It appears that the Canadians had stopped to aid a civilian motorist and their suspicions were aroused when they found occupants of the car supplied with "terrific" quantities of red pellets.
