From the Guardian's correspondent at East Point: From a reliable man I learn that fifty four years ago in 1852 the schooner "Speed" Captain Michael Campion arrived from Boston on the 7th of January and saw no ice. Again about that time and earlier in the century, the sea ice was often used as a highway.

Travellers drove on it from North Lake to St. Peter's and some time early in 1800, three men, Laughlin McDonald, grandfather of the present Laughlin McDonald, East Point, and two Beaton's left East Point for Murray Harbor with three loads of wheat by the sea ice, there being no grist mills in this section. They arrived at Murray Harbor, drove up to the head of Murray River, got their wheat ground and returned the same way. On returning they took a straight course from Murray Harbor to East Point which would bring them many miles outside of land. When off Holo Bay they decided to call and see a man, who owned vessels at that early period, about a trip to Newfoundland, with which they had some trade. The people of Holo Bay seeing the three sleighs coming in from sea naturally supposed they were coming from Nova Scotia.—Joseph S. 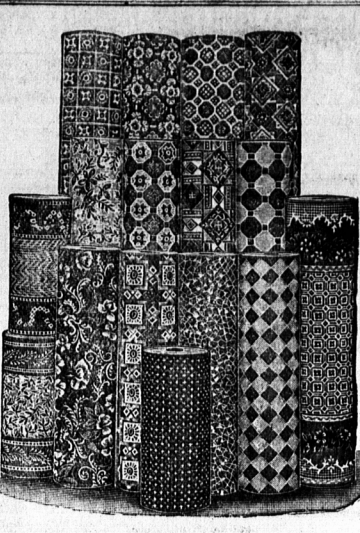
