WORK OF THE WOMEN

STRANGE PATHS THEY CHOOSE IN EFFORT TO GET SUBSISTENCE.

Try to Prove Themselves as Much Men's Equal in Laborious as Well as Mental Work—London County Council's Pledge to Enable Women to Sit on County Councils, and Although the Council will probably adopt the recommendation, it is very unlikely that Parliament will take any notice of the appeal.

These are unhappy times for the women's rights movement in London. Although a committee has recommended the London County Council to petition Parliament to take steps to enable women to sit on County Councils, and although the Council will probably adopt the recommendation, it is very unlikely that Parliament will take any notice of the appeal.

If it depended on the County Council, the battle of the women would be won. Every Council since the body came into existence has petitioned Parliament in the interest of women members, and Parliament has steadfastly ignored the appeal.

It will, indeed, be in the memory of all Londoners that three ladies—two elected by the ratepayers and one selected as an alderman by the Council—did actually serve on the first L. C. C., until the judges determined that they had no right to be there.

For the last five years women have lost, and lost heavily, in their cause. Not long ago they could serve as guardians, as members of the School Board, as parish and district councillors, and as members of the London vestries.

There are no London vestries now, and women cannot sit on the borough Councils which have superseded them.

Woman's Chances. The work of the School Board is to be transferred to the County Council, and on that body women cannot sit. And only a little while ago Mr. Long hinted that the administration of the Poor Law will also be transferred to the municipal authorities, from which women are barred.

It is pointed out, as if women ought to be elated thereby, that the Education Act makes it compulsory that each scheme shall provide for the inclusion of women as well as men among the members of the education committee.

In conjunction with these circumstances it is interesting to notice the inclusion of women into occupations usually connected with men, as revealed by a new blue book dealing with the census of 1901.

They are female cellar-men, female boatmen, female watchmen, and female warehousemen, not to mention female paintmen and female railway porters, female bell-hangers, blacksmiths, bootmakers, bricklayers, masons, miners, carpenters, paperhangers, whitewashers, gasfitters, dock laborers, saddlers, sawyers, shepherds, tailors, tanners, and undertakers.

Truthful Figures. The returns show that in England and Wales, females find employment as follows: 6 architects, 2 accountants, 86 auctioneers, 19,228 bookbinders, 39 bailiffs, 46,769 bakers, 362 barbers, 27,707 barmaids, 6 bayonet-makers, 1,042 bedstead-makers, 2 bell-hangers, 56 bill discounters, 316 blacksmiths, 420 boatmen, 4 boiler-makers, 43,776 bootmakers, 4,298 brass-workers, 3,071 brick-makers, 4 bricklayers, 177 builders, 8,850 butchers, 757 cabinet-makers, 600 carmen, 56 carpenters, 182 coachmakers, 1,316 cellar-men, 1,911 chain-makers, 3,105 chemists, 54 chimney-sweepers, 72,046 clerks, 1,746 clock-makers, 30 coopers, 6 copper miners, 5,743 curriers, 2,527 cutters, 2,929 cycle-makers, 186 decorators, 1 dock laborer, 212 doctors, 140 dentists, 608 fish curers, 166 fishermen, 4,325 French polishers, 7 gasfitters, 8,805 general laborers, 806 glass-makers, 5,170 goldsmiths, 188 gunsmiths, 5,140 gardeners, 1,745 hairdressers, 4 hurdle-makers, 399 ironfounders, 15 lead miners, 11 limeburners, 42 masons, 4,991 messengers, 211 metal machinists, 3 millwrights, 2,604 nailmakers, 1,702 packing-case makers, 99 paper-hangers, 9,693 printers, 115 plumbers, 3 plasterers, 745 porters (railway), 3,239 ropemakers, 1 road laborer, 4,780 saddlers, 155 sawmakers, 10 sawyers, 12 shepherds, 3 slaters, 3 slaughterers, 222 stove-makers, 117,640 tailors, 71 tanners, 279 undertakers, 3 veterinary surgeons, 1,101 warehousemen, 79 wheelwrights, 1 woodman, 8 zinc workers.

It will thus be seen that, while recent legislation has tended to deprive women of rights in the capacity of a public representative, her sphere of employment has increased to a remarkable extent.

Chamberlain's Monocle. From July 15, 1876, when he first entered the house of commons, to his recent return to England from Africa, the most salient feature of Mr. Chamberlain's personal appearance has been his eyeglass. From the very first it fascinated the popular imagination. The idea of Birmingham, Radical, Republican Chamberlain with a monocle staggered the house, though Disraeli, John Bright and other M. P.'s favored the same ail to vision. Disraeli, who heard Mr. Chamberlain's maiden speech, gave, it is said, as his only opinion that "he wears his eyeglass like a gentleman."

A Colossal Picture. M. Georges Bernand of Paris, after eight years of labor, has just finished what is probably the largest picture ever painted. It covers 150 square yards of canvas. It represents the funeral of President Carnot at the Pantheon, through the open doors of which is seen a gorgeous catafalque surrounded by the most prominent men of France, while the foreign ambassadors, after saluting the coffin, pass before the catafalque.
