RUSSIANS ABANDON MOON ISLAND

PETROGRAD, Oct. 21.—Via London—The text of the Russian official statement issued today reads:

"Baltic sea. Under pressure of superior enemy naval forces we have been compelled to abandon southern Moon Sound, Moon Island thus came under the direct fire of enemy ships, from the Gulf of Riga and also from Kassar Bay, and we were completely deprived of the possibility of defending Moon Island, and therefore decided that no useful purpose would be served by attempting to hold it. The evacuation of this island was begun under very difficult conditions as it was all the time subjected to a cross fire from the enemy's ships. Our destroyers, trawlers and auxiliary ships engaged them.

"During the day our trawlers dis-

covered mine fields sown by enemy submarines with the obvious intention of closing to our ships the entrance to the Gulf of Riga from Moon Sound. These operations, co-ordinated with the landing of detachments of Dago Island, show unmistakably the desire of the enemy at all costs to destroy our naval forces defending this region."

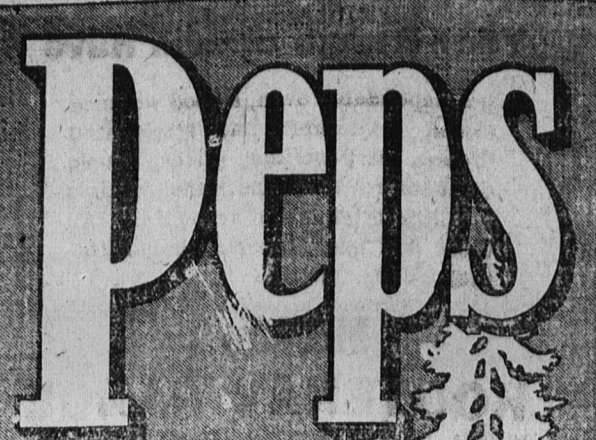

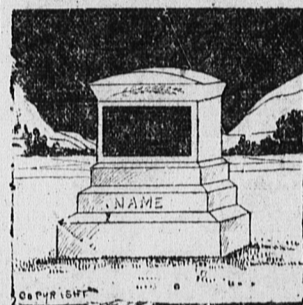
