BOSTON BROWNIES

Cream 1-3 cup butter, gradually work into it 1 cup fine granulated sugar. Melt 2 1/2 squares bitter chocolate over hot water, and add to the sugar mixture, together with 2 well-beaten eggs. Sift 1/2 teaspoon salt with 1 cup flour, and add 1 teaspoon vanilla and 1/2 cup walnuts chopped fine. Spread mixture in a thin layer on a well greased pan, and bake slowly for 20 minutes. When cool cut in oblongs and dust with sugar.
