### Water is Aid To Good Teeth

Good teeth, especially in children, are governed to a large extent by the kind of water they usually drink. In places where the water is "hard," that is, containing a large quantity of lime, there is much less demand for the services of dentists than where the main supply of drinking water is "soft." This is what one expects, as lime enters largely into the making of teeth, but it is only recently that the matter has been settled by the scientific investigation among school children in England. More and more attention is being given to the condition of school children's teeth, because of the disastrous effects of bad teeth upon the general health.

Children who appear badly nourished rarely have sound teeth. Bad teeth nearly always cause bad eyesight. The suspicion that the character of water habitually drunk had much to do with the condition of the teeth was amply proved. The inquiry was conducted in localities supplying water of varying hardness, and the percentage of teeth varied according to the hardness of the water supplied in their locality. It was also found that fewer babies and young children died in proportion in those districts where the water was hard, simply because they had better teeth, and could chew their food better. The harder the water, in fact, the better the teeth and the better the health.

### Stainless Spoons

The housewife may now, for the first time, buy stainless and rust-proof spoons and forks. They are made of chrome steel and are rather expensive, but have the advantage of needing no polishing.

Not long ago it was discovered that ordinary carbon steel could be rendered proof against oxidation and also against acids by introducing into it 13 per cent. of chromium. The idea of utilizing it for cutlery was obvious enough, but the first effort made in that direction met with serious obstacles. Eventually, however, they were solved, and so-called "stainless" became familiar.

The chrome steel is extremely hard and cannot be forged by hand in the time-honored fashion known with a power hammer. Its rustproof quality makes it available for many uses, and it is now cast into stair rods, fire irons, stove grates and other articles for the household. Automobile parts are being made of the same material.

The problem of producing satisfactory spoons and forks of chrome steel did not find a solution until very recently. It is claimed for them that they are far better than electro-plate, being machine-polished and retaining their gloss indefinitely without cleaning with anything more than soap and water.

### ACCUSED RED CROSS COMMISSIONER

WIGA, Aug. 4.—Prior to his departure for Berlin last night, United States Senator Joseph I. France, of Maryland, personally accused Dr. Edward W. Ryan, United States Red Cross Commissioner, of having instigated the revolt at Kronstadt last winter. Thereupon Dr. Ryan expressed his opinion of the Senator's credence in what Dr. Ryan termed Bolshevik reports, and of the Senator's dealings with the Bolsheviks in general.

Dr. Ryan has been engaged in Red Cross and other relief work in various parts of Europe since early in the war. His home is in Scranton, Pa. He fought the typhus in Serbia, and also did notable relief work for the Red Cross during the great fire in Salonika. In 1919 he was made executive officer in relief work in Austria by Herbert Hoover, and in 1920 was placed at the head of the Red Cross commission in Estonia. After a visit to Russia he reported that the Bolshevik Government was "a social adventure become a ghastly failure." The mutiny in Kronstadt began early in February, 1921, when Soviet sailors in the Baltic revolted and seized the city, which was held for about 15 days, when it was surrendered to the Soviet forces. All officers and civilian leaders in the revolt were captured and executed.

### NEW BRUNSWICK MAY PASS PROTECTIVE LAWS FOR FORESTS

FREDERICTON, N. B., Aug. 5.—The New Brunswick Government will be urged at the next session of the Legislature to enact legislation requiring all anglers entering the woods during the forest fire season to take out a permit, according to an announcement made after the meeting of the Forestry Advisory Board here today. Over 300 forest fires in the Province, many of which were traced to the carelessness of fishermen, were responsible for this decision of the Advisory Board, which represents lessees of public lands and owners of private lumber limits. Additional penalties for carelessness will also be asked.

### Bat Has Super-Senses

The bat, whose wings are a mass of nerves which enable it to avoid objects in flight, is declared by scientists to be one of the most wonderful of all animals in its physical makeup. It is claimed for it that it has from one to three senses that no other animal has. So delicate are the nerves in its wings and so responsive to air vibrations that a bat can be blinded and turned loose in a room where several objects are hanging

each as rich as the former Silver Islet vein.

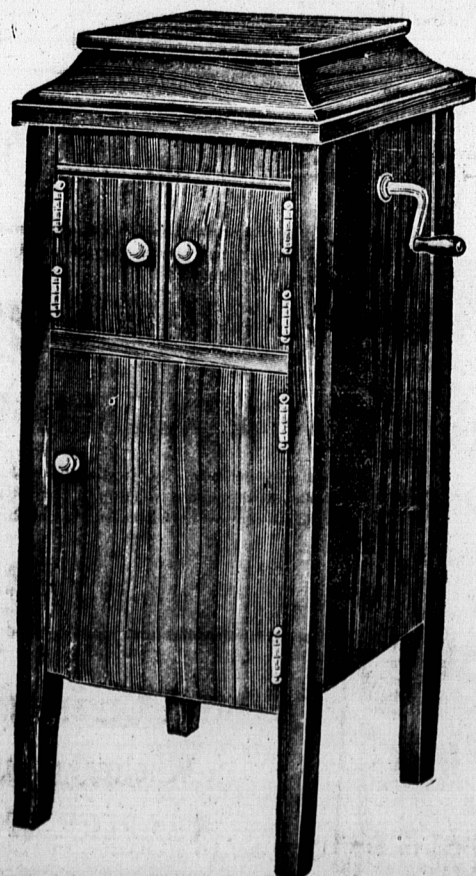
### Had the Right Idea.
