"BEER BARREL POLKA" WAR'S BIGGEST SONG HIT

LONDON, Jan. 13—Biggest song hit of this war is the "Beer Barrel Polka." Canadian soldiers sang it when they debarked in England. Australian and New Zealand soldiers sang it when they landed down the gangplank in the Middle East. English soldiers sang it as they trudged through the mud of France. And shelter-dwellers in London sing it while the bombs whistle down about them.

Running a close second on England's "hit parade" is the American best-seller "South of the Border," which, incidentally, was written by England's best known song-writing team, Jimmy Kennedy and Michael Carr. It has sold nearly a half-million copies.

Third place probably goes to "Wish Me Luck When You See Me Good-Bye," with which Gracie Fields, the English comedienne sang her way into the hearts of the British army, navy and air force. Some 450,000 copies have been sold.

NOTHING LIKE TIPPERARY

Carr, working alone, wrote the song that is in fourth place in popularity warmed after the British retreat to Dunkirk.

But none of the songs of this war approach the sales of England's hits of the Great War. For instance, "It's a Long Way to Tipperary" sold 5,000,000 copies, "Roses of Picardy," 3,000,000 and "The Home Fires Burning," more than 1,000,000 copies.

Songs symbolizing the universal hope for better days ahead are finding a ready market. One publisher commissioned Irving Berlin to write a song expressing this thought. Berlin produced "It's a Lovely Day Tomorrow," which sold 100,000 copies.

Others that have sold well include "It's a Happy Day" and "We'll Go Smiling Along."

Congress Sect. Moslem League Still At Odds

LONDON, Jan. 13—(CP)—Like the vexed question of India's constitutional difficulties, the Moslem League and the British political scene at intervals and causes responsible opinion to divert momentarily from discussion of war problems in India.

The political situation there is deadlocked following the Congress Party's rejection of the Viceroy's offer last August of seats on an enlarged executive council and has been aggravated by a Congress campaign against co-operation in the war.

As all the prominent Congress leaders find their way to jail due to the Gandhi-inspired campaign, some faint hope for solution comes in reports from India that moderate political elements emphasize the need of securing a settlement of the constitutional question.

The Times, in a long leading editorial, expressed the opinion that it is doubtful whether Gandhi or Jinnah, leader of the All-India Moslem League, and other veteran leaders sitting in themselves from party controversies to ponder suggestions for a new approach to the problem. It asked, however, whether there are no younger men who desire not communal or factional triumphs but the peace and unity of India, to study new solutions?

AMERY'S VIEW

Some suggestions for a new approach were contained in a speech by R. Hon. L. S. Amery, secretary of state for India, to the Moslem speaking union. He thought Moslem fears of being swamped by the Hindu majority might be eased by a further increase in powers of provincial government "subject only to the minimum of central control necessary to secure some measure of unity in foreign, defensive and economic policy."

Amery wondered whether functional representation—members being elected by their professions—might relieve the communal difficulties. He thought Moslems might be satisfied if they were given a majority in the provinces and a Moslem farmer of the same district should vote together with that of their names be kept on separate registers perpetuating religious differences.

The secretary also thought "our whole conception of a parliamentary executive is for the central government at any rate is suited than an executive on American lines, that is independent of the legislature for the term of its office, whether directly elected or nominated by the provinces and state, and with definite proportions allotted to the different main elements."

Despite the wish of moderate men, there is no immediate sign of agreement between the Congress Party and the Moslem League on the main constitutional issue—whether the Congress majority should not represent India as a whole. The Congress Party, which has a majority of votes in the British Indian electorate, claims to have the last word in any Constituent Assembly which would draw up the constitution of a new India. The Moslem League, however, refused to admit the All-India character of the Congress party.

Some Congress newspapers welcome the tendency to rapprochement between the two parties, but a proposal for a National Government—which would operate under a constitution drafted by the Constituent Assembly—cannot be made the basis of any new approach. They urged it should be possible to allay the fears of minorities.

The British authorities regarded the national government plan as possible to deal with in wartime and counted the proposal with the offer to expand the Viceroy's executive council. Moderate elements have made suggestions designed to obtain sufficient agreement between the Congress party and the Moslem League as would justify establishment of an interim government containing representation of popular elements.

Some observers believe that by this means a compromise might be possible between the Congress demand for a full-fledged national government and the British proposal for an expanded executive council.

NEW FURNITURE MODELS SHOWN BY MANUFACTURERS

TORONTO, Jan. 13—Several new features in household furniture, designed before the Government placed a ban on new models, are in evidence at the Ontario Retail Furniture Dealers' Association convention being held this week at the Royal York Hotel.

Perhaps the newest and most modern article is that featured by a Toronto furniture maker, who is showing a new type of lounge-chair bed, designed by him for use in small apartments where sleeping space for the guest is always a problem.

Another improvement in the heavier furniture is the davenport, which does not require removal from its position against the wall for conversion into a bed. Lift the seat, and a double bed is ready for sleeping.

Restriction on imports from United States too, has had a definite effect on increased quantity of Canadian-made evening material for chest-of-drawers and chairs. With the exception of some imported fabric, it was stated.

Stoves too, have many new improvements, including a new type of Canadian-made electrical element which will likely be named after its inventor, Erickson of Ottawa. The new element is said to produce greater heat.
