### THE LATE CHIEF OF THE McNEILS OF BARRA.

The McNeils were originally known as the Clan Gilladannan, or the clan of the servant of Adamnan, a name which means little Adam. Gilladannan, in Gaelic Gilleadhannain, was changed, first, to Gilleouan or Gillowann, and next, to Gaileon. Neil, a descendant of Gilladannan, was born probably about the year 1280. The descendants of Neil dropped the name Macgilladannan and called themselves Macneils, or sons of Neil. Murdoch, son of Neil, was succeeded by his son Roderick, who must have been born about the year 1380. Roderick married, about 1409, a daughter of Ferchar Maclean, and obtained possession of the Isle of Barra. He was the first Macneil of Barra. Gilladannan, oldest son of Roderick, received in 1427 a charter or deed of the Island of Barra from Alexander Macdonald, Lord of Gilleouan, obtained a crown charter of Barra in 1688. He married a grand-daughter of Sir James Macdonald of Sleat, who was a son of Sir Donald of Sleat by his wife, Janet Mackenzie, daughter of Lord Mackenzie of Kintail. Sir Donald of Sleat, son of Alexander, Earl of Ross, and Lord of the Isles. By his wife, the grand-daughter of Sir James of Sleat, Roderick Macneil of Barra had four sons, Roderick, Gilleouan, Donald, and James. General Roderick Macneil, a descendant of Roderick, son of Roderick, died in London in 1863. He was the last Macneil who owned Barra.

Roderick, second son of the Roderick who received a crown charter of Barra in 1688, had a son named Roderick. This Roderick was known as Rory of Brevaig. He married Catherine Macdonald, and by her had Rory Og, Galleon, Lachlan, Catherine and Margaret. He came with his family to Prince Edward Island in 1802, and in 1803 settled on Brevaig farm at Verac River. Rory Og, eldest son of Roderick of Brevaig, was born in Barra in 1777. He taught school for a few years and then settled on a part of his father's land and was a very intelligent man and was highly respected for his good sense and manliness. He married in 1811 Catherine McEabern, and by her had Margaret, Roderick, Mary, Lachlan, Catherine, Janet, Ann and Donald. He died in 1850. Lachlan, second son of Rory Og, was born in 1819. He married Isabel McPherson, by whom he had four sons, Roderick, Angus, Lachlan and Murdoch. He succeeded General Roderick Macneil as chief of the Macneils of Barra in 1863. He died in 1892.

Roderick, eldest son of Lachlan, succeeded his father as chief of the Macneils of Barra. He was born March 10, 1845. He was tall and strong, kind-hearted and very friendly. He visited me frequently at the manse in Belfast, and called to see him several times at River. I respected him for his own sake and for the sake of his position as the hereditary chief of a Highland Clan. It was always a pleasure to me to meet him and have a talk with him.

### EMPEROR WILLIAM LEAVES FOR KIEL.

POTSDAM, June 23—Emperor William left at 8 a. m. by train for Hamburg on his way to attend the yachting regatta at Kiel.

As His Majesty stepped out of the palace he appeared somewhat pale, but walked without limping. It is understood that the inflammation at his right knee joint is nearly healed.

### DENY THAT KAISER WAS OPERATED ON.

BERLIN, June 23—The Emperor's physicians, Drs. von Ilberg and Niedner, issued a statement today with reference to the affection of the knee from which the Emperor is suffering. They state that the inflammation is taking a most favorable course and that the discharge has now almost ceased.

They deny absolutely that the trouble is furuncular in character and assert that no operation was performed yesterday, as has been reported, adding that Dr. Bier, who was said to have been the operating surgeon, did not visit the palace yesterday.

### ROOSEVELT'S CONFERENCE.

NEW YORK, June 23—Theodore Roosevelt has asked Governor Hughes to visit him at Sagamore Hill, in the near future, for a conference. Mr. Roosevelt did not say he had received the Governor's acceptance and he refused to give any hint of what subjects he expected to come up in conference.

But taken as part of a conversation which had to do with direct primaries, the mere announcement aroused the keenest speculation.

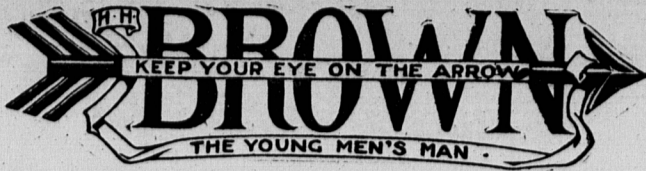
