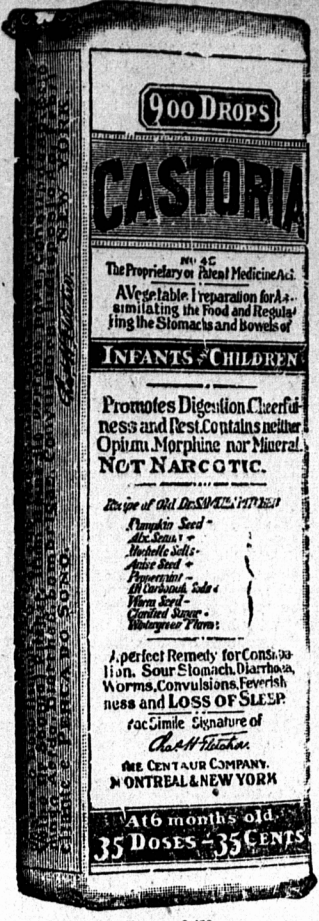

UNSTOPPING THE SINK. When the drain pipe of the kitchen sink becomes clogged up, try the following suggested by Clarence W. Carroll, of Rochester, N. Y., to the "Technical World Magazine": Cut a piece of leather large enough to cover the sink plate. Remove the nozzle from the garden hose and make a hole in its center large enough to screw the nozzle on the terminal into. Having secured on the leather, place this over the sink plate, hold it tightly down and turn on the water. If no water be allowed to leak out from under the leather, the drain pipe will get the full pressure from the faucet, and this will usually be sufficient to send the obstruction through the pipe.
