There was a fairly large attendance at Crystal Rink yesterday afternoon to witness the hockey match between the Defenders of Summerside and the Northern Lights of St. Eleanors which resulted in a victory for the visiting team. At half time the score stood 5-4 in favor of St. Eleanors and at the finish the scores were even 9-9. The Summerside team refused to play off on account of a dispute over a goal which they claimed and the St. Eleanors team shot a goal and were awarded the game.

Last night a number of friends assembled at the home of John S. Ramsay to tender a fare well by Rev. F. W. Harlow whom they presented with a kindly worded address and a souvenir quilt in token of the warm friendship existing between pastor and congregation. Mr. Harlow tendered his resignation as pastor of Central Street Christian Church Summerside, at the annual meeting held on Wednesday night and intends leaving on Tuesday next for Ohio. During his residence of about three years here Mr. Harlow has endeared himself to the congregation and has been very successful in his ministerial labors. As a result the church has made highly satisfactory progress. During the present season alone, after a course of revival meetings held a few weeks ago, there were fourteen additions to the church membership. The members of the congregation are sorry to lose their pastor who has been ever faithful and earnest in his work, and citizens generally will regret his departure. Next Sunday Mr. Harlow will preach his farewell sermon.
