Mr. HOWARD SILLIPHANT of this town who went to New York Hospital for treatment some months ago, returned home yesterday evening. He was not benefitted by his trip.

Mr. S. H. JONES is not shipping rabbits—alho there was one caught in a carload of sheep that arrived for him from the west yesterday morning. It is not known how bunny got smuggled in among the sheep, but it is said that when being put on board at Port Hill one of the lambs escaped to the woods, and the boy who was sent in pursuit brought back a rabbit by mistake. Frank Gould who captured the prize on its arrival here still has it in his possession and values it as a veritable mascot.

Mr. S. H. JONES shipped 670 lambs yesterday to Boston. He has bought to date 10,191 lambs and sheep, of which 9,872 have been shipped. He has also shipped 4,200 geese. He exports to ship this morning two cars sheep for Liverpool and two cars lambs for Boston which will about close his season's work. He informs the GUARDIAN that he could have shipped three to five thousand turkeys but was unable to procure a sufficient quantity suitable for market. To secure a profitable market for turkeys it would be necessary to have them in Boston and New York in time for Thanksgiving trade, which in these cities is a very large one, and our farmers are standing in their own light in not being prepared for it.
