

The highest price being paid for live pork at the Dominion Pork Factory is 52 cts per lb.

The store lately occupied by G. G. Jury in the new Prowse Block, Sunnyside, has been taken by the Sun Life Assurance Co. and will be completely renovated in the course of a few days. The new agent of the Sun Life, E. B. Brow will begin business in the new offices on May 1st.

AMONG the innovations shortly to be introduced by the P. E. I. Telephone Co. is a nickel in the slot Telephone at the Railway Station. This will be a great benefit to travellers and the public generally who frequent that building, as a telephone is the most frequently sought after article in the locality.

A SYSTEM of inter-communicating telephones will shortly be installed in the Provincial Court House by the Telephone Company. The system will comprise one desk set and three walls. The desk telephone will be placed in the room of the Master of the Rolls and the walls in Chambers, Prothonotary's office and the Chief Justice's room.

The annual five mile run held under the auspices of the Sydney Y. M. C. A. will take place on May 24th. Ten good prizes are offered. The event is under M. P. A. A. sanction and the only qualification is that the participant be an amateur. For further information enquire of Secretary of Y. M. C. A. Charlottetown. A large number of good athletes should be represented in this event.

The ring belonging to James Egan, for the sealing of which Seymour Gregory was arraigned at the Police Court several days ago has been found on the corner of the Medical Hall where Gregory shook hands with Egan, by a street sweeper by the name of Dan McKenna. The charge against Gregory was dismissed by the Magistrate and the finding of the ring on the street now completely establishes his innocence.

WINFIELD, manager of the Telephone Co. and his assistants Messrs Whitlock and McNeill went west yesterday afternoon and will be engaged for several days in re-laying the telephone line between Summerside and Conway. A new telephone station will also be installed at Portage. On their return to the city they will begin work on the new line to Mount Stewart necessitated on account of the breaking of the cable to Southport. The new line will greatly relieve the old one to Mount Stewart and make communication with the sections of the Island to the south of the Hillsboro much easier than at present.

MARY ANN BINT, relict of the late George Jay, Pisquid East, died on Friday 8th of April at the home of her daughter Mrs. Benjamin Jay, aged 66 years. During her long and painful illness she was tenderly cared for by her daughters and sons. Early in life Mrs. Jay was brought under Christian influences which refined and beautified her character and made her a devoted wife and mother, and also caused her to be highly esteemed by all who knew her.
