DIED at the Russell Hospital in Minneapolis, Minn. Jan. 5th, 1906, William Warren Gillis, son of John A. Gillis of Victoria Cross. Young Mr. Gillis, after leaving his native province lived at Winnipeg, Man. for four years, and had lived in Minneapolis for about three years previous to his death, following his trade as a tailor. His last illness extended over about eight months. It started with a severe cold which he seemed unable to throw off and which developed rapidly into tuberculosis of the lungs contributory to gastric trouble. His last few weeks were attended with great suffering during much of the time, but were characterized by the most patient and cheerful disposition. His unwavering faith and peaceful submission to the will of his Heavenly Father were most beautiful to see. He thought only of others and tried in every way to save trouble for his nurses and friends who were in constant attendance to the last. His quiet disposition was such that not many knew the real man—those near him in his last days came thoroughly to realize the beauty and strength of his character. The funeral was conducted by the Rev. Otis G. Dale, pastor of the Presbyterian Church which he attended. For the service, Mr. Dale took the Bible which had been personally used by the deceased and read numerous passages that he had underscored before and during his last illness. The nature of the marked portions revealed much of the deep religious nature of man. The remains were taken from the hospital to the residence of Mr. Partridge, formerly of Charlottetown. Royalty. The funeral was attended by the "Tailor's Union" of the city in a body, two hundred and fifty in number, and the floral tributes were very appropriate and beautiful. Though far from home and among strangers, Mr. Gillis had warm and devoted friends with him to the last. His taking away at the age of twenty-nine has seemed all the more sad because of the hopes he had entertained of soon establishing a Christian home; Miss Lucy Partridge to whom he was engaged to be married was most devoted and self-sacrificing in her ministrations to him during his last illness. Jas. Partridge, the deceased's closest friend, was by him almost constantly toward the last. Besides his numerous sorrowing friends here, there are left to mourn this sad death, his father, John A. Gillis, his brother Hiram in Nova Scotia; a brother Horace H. in Ontario; a brother Jas. G. in Sydney C. B. and a sister Mary M. at Victoria Cross.
