LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY Prince Edward Island

RULES RELATING TO PRIVATE BILLS.

36. All petitions for Private Bills must be presented within fourteen days after the commencement of the session exclusive of adjournment. 37. No private Bill shall be brought into the House, but upon a petition first presented at the suitors for such Bill and such petition must be signed by said parties. 38. A committee will be appointed at the commencement of every Session consisting of five members, of whom three shall be quorum, to be designated "The Private Bills Committee" to whom shall be referred every private Bill, and no proceedings after the first reading shall be had upon such Bill until such Committee has reported thereon to the House. 39. So soon as the Committee has reported any Bill, such Bill together with any amendments that may be suggested by the Committee, shall be printed at the expense of the parties who are suitors for such Bill and printed copies thereof delivered to the members before the second reading if deemed necessary by the Committee. 40. No Bill for the particular interests of any person or persons, Corporation or Corporations, or body or bodies of people shall be read a second time until all fees be paid for the same into the hands of the Clerk of the House. 41. No Bill having for its object the vesting in or conferring upon any person or persons, Municipality or Body Corporate the title to any tract of land shall be received or read in the House unless at least for four weeks notice containing a full description of the land in question has been published in the Royal Gazette and one other newspaper in this province of the intention of such person or persons.

ANOTHER LINK OF N. T. R. OPERATED BY GOVERNMENT

The Edmundston and Levis Section Opened for Traffic November 23rd: A Tri-Weekly Service for the Present.

On Monday, November 23rd, the Government railways commenced to operate another section of the National Transcontinental, that between Edmundston and Levis, a distance of 237 miles. For the present there will be a tri-weekly service, leaving Edmundston at 5 a. m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday, arriving at Levis at 6.40 p. m. same day, and leaving Levis at 6.30 a. m. Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, arriving at Edmundston at 8.10 p. m. same days. Officials who have recently inspected this new section pronounce the road-bed in first class condition, and the surrounding country with excellent opportunities for the lumberman, farmer and sportsman. The Levis Edmundston and Edmundston-Moncton division of the National Transcontinental have a total of 463 miles operated by the Canadian Government Railways. D. P. A. BAPTIST MEETINGS AT BEACH POINT

The quarterly meetings at Beach Point commenced on Thursday evening, Dec. 1 with a rousing temperance meeting.

Owing to the train arriving late a change had to be made in the programme and the whole evening was given up to the discussion of Temperance Problems on P. E. Island. The speaker was the Rev. W. D. Wilson, Field Secy. of the Temperance Alliance. Among other problems he emphasised the corruption of public life, the intemperance of the people, laxity in admiration of the law and the past unorganized Temperance party.

After a clear and stirring address a time was given for questions and the intense interest of the meeting was revealed in the number who availed themselves of the opportunity. At the close an opportunity was given for the members of the audience to pledge their support to the Temperance Alliance for the return of Temperance Candidates at next election; with the result that nearly all present either signed right away or brought the pledge cards later.

Wednesday forenoon was given up to general business and listening to and discussing a splendid paper on Ministerial education and Evangelism by Rev. F. G. Hubley. The paper was commended by all present.

The afternoon session was devoted to miscellaneous other general business and was brought to a close at 5 p. m.

In the evening after a short song service Rev. L. E. Ackland preached a most eloquent and impressive sermon on "Conquering Christ."

After the sermon a song and Testimony meeting was held during which many took part. These meetings have been the best held for a considerable time and Baptists not present missed much of inspiration and power.

BULWARK DISASTER NOT AN ACCIDENT

NEW YORK, Dec. 3.—A cable to the Herald from London says:—The authorities, it is stated, are not absolutely satisfied that the disaster to the battleship Bulwark was due to an accident.

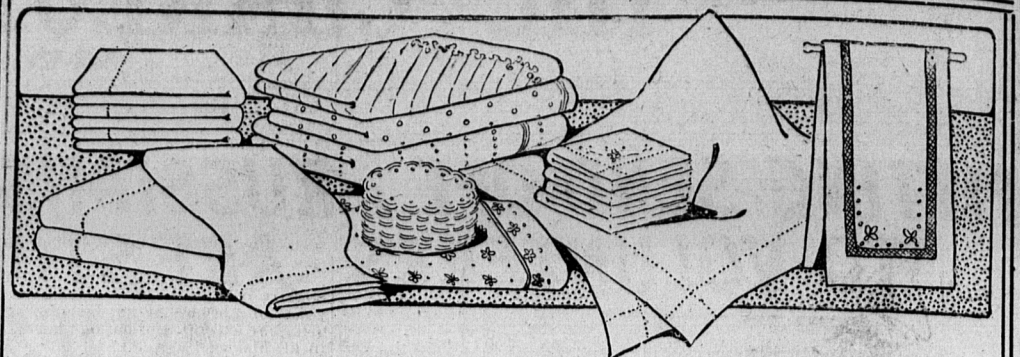
