before it is too late. There are a great many men in the prime of life who are bald who could have had healthy heads of hair if they had given some thought to this matter in their earlier years.

In the first place, keep up your general health by wise diet, active exercise and hygienic living. Avoid tight hair bands. Give your hair and scalp an air and sun bath every day. Remember that the scalp needs fresh air, sunshine and exercise just as your body needs them. Scalp massage is very necessary to stimulate the circulation of blood through the scalp. Usually a tight scalp is the cause of thin, falling hair. Massage will loosen the skin and keep the scalp in a flexible condition. Brush your hair with clean military brushes for several minutes every night and morning. The brushing strengthens the tiny muscles in the scalp and removes all the dead or dying hair, thus stimulating the circulation and helping the new hair to grow. Use a stimulating scalp tonic and a scalp food two or three times a week. Give the hair the warm-oil treatment and use a mild liquid shampoo to wash the hair at regular intervals. (2) After shaving bathe the face for several minutes in warm water to which has been added one teaspoonful of boric acid. THE MARKETS

(Canadian Press)

MONTREAL, Que., May 26.—Butter prices to the retail trade were reduced one cent per pound in Montreal today. Solids were quoted at 33 cents per pound and prints at 32 cents per pound in wholesale channels for large lots. Eastern townships No. 1, pasteurized was sold at 29 cents per pound. New Zealand butter was quoted with asking prices around 30 cents per pound. Receipts were 1,474 boxes. Cheese ruled about steady with little business done. Receipts were 1,564 boxes. Eggs were reduced one cent per dozen to retailers. Other lines were unchanged. Receipts were 3,912 cases. Prices for both old and new potatoes were reduced today. New Carolina No. 1 potatoes sold to jobbers off track here at \$8.75 per 1550 pound barrels. No 2 grade went \$5.50. Old potatoes were quoted per 90 pounds in bulk at \$1.75 to \$1.80 for New Brunswicks and \$1.60 for Quebecs.
