FRANCE APPEALS TO LEAGUE COUNCIL

Next Six Months Regarded Crucial Period For Peace

France Dispatches Stern Note Of Protest To Berlin And Calls For Immediate Action By The League Of Nations.

(By Joseph E. Sharkey, Associated Press Foreign Staff) (A. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) GENEVA, March 20—An extraordinary session of the League of Nations Council to deal with France's appeal against German rearmament probably will be held Thursday, March 28, League officials said tonight.

HEADLINES REVEAL PANIC CAUSED BY HITLER'S EDICT

German Nation "Plays At War" As Peace Of Europe Threatened. French Note Awaited By German Foreign Office. (By Louis P. Lochner, Associated Press Foreign Staff) (A. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) BERLIN, March 20—Headlines told Germany today her arms "emancipation" had spread "panic" in the world's capitals as new air manoeuvres simulating war conditions testified to the Reich's growing military power.

Senate Sets Brisk Pace

OTTAWA, March 20—Stepping at a brisk pace, the Senate today made a drive on its legislative slate. It put the measures approving the protocol to the Canada-France trade agreement and anti-partite conference Saturday to be held at Paris, and accepted the invitation of the Soviet Union to send Foreign Minister Pierre Laval to Moscow for conferences with the Soviet dictator Joseph Stalin.

POINTS OUT DANGER

The Deutsche Diplomatische Korrespondenz, mouthpiece of the government, pointed to the danger of the "formation of armed blocs of enemies" in Europe, and said: "Germany has been interested in knowing that friendships (the reference being to French and British amity) aren't exaggerated into conspiracies against other nations."

Reflect Confidence

The press comments apparently reflected Germany's new confidence, inspired by Adolf Hitler's re-institution of compulsory military service Saturday and Gen. Hermann Wilhelm Goerring's disclosure earlier in the week that the Reich has an "official" air force.

ENTHRONEMENT OF ARCHBISHOP MCGUIGAN

Installed As Roman Catholic Archbishop of Toronto In A Solemn Ceremony.
