New Automatic Test For Diabetes

BUFFALO, May 5 — (AP) — The next step against diabetes will be a machine that does blood tests automatically, to find hidden cases. It will be able to test 500 persons a day. It will need the help of only two laboratory workers, taking less than a drop of blood from each person being tested. The machine will do all the testing. It will point to the people who may have diabetes.

One survey indicates that 2,000,000 Americans have diabetes and that nearly half of them don't suspect it.

The machine will be an improvement on a quick and simple blood test already being used. The test was developed by doctors Hugh L. C. Wilkerson and Erich Heftmann of the United States Public Health Service in Boston.

It is being demonstrated here by the New York State Department of Health and the Public Health Service in an exhibit at the New York State Medical Society's annual meeting. Physicians are getting the five-minute test to see how it works.
