### For the Old Timers

"I. C. R." writing in the Halifax Herald says:

I have before me Benj. Bremner's "Memories of Long Ago," being a series of sketches pertaining to Charlottetown in the past, and printed. I should judge, for private circulation. It is a most interesting production, interesting and instructive not only to the old timers over there in Charlottetown, but to the young folks. For it depicts Charlottetown as it was fifty years ago and in a manner both pleasing and fascinating. Mr. Bremner has done his native province a public service. For as Mr. Bremner quotes: "When a land forgets its legends, Sees but falsehoods in the past; When a nation views its aires In the light of fools and liars, 'Tis a sign of its decline. And its glories cannot last; Branches that but blith their roots Yield no sap for lasting fruits." The establishment of an art gallery and museum will, however, atone for the apparent indifference that prevailed in the past. Mr. Bremner's book is of intense interest to Islanders now living in other lands. It's a true picture of life in that little city half a century or more ago. The engravings, too, are of special interest. Most, if not all, were made from sketches so happily preserved. "I. C. R." has been devoting a portion

of the space allotted him for this weekly letter to just such things as Mr. Bremner has incorporated in his splendidly printed booklet, the reading of which, to him, is like living over again the good, and the bad, old days, when the old men of today were kids, and not the least of the interesting engravings is that of Mr. Bremner himself, whose features seem so strangely familiar to "I. C. R." though he has not seen that gentleman for half a century. I heartily thank Mr. Bremner for his kindness in sending me a copy of his book and I need not tell him how eagerly I devoured its contents at one sitting. He has contributed a splendid chapter to the records of his own province and Canada. He has given a keen insight into our mode of living half a century ago, how Prince Edward Islanders lived and conducted themselves at that time and in previous years; the public institutions, the churches, the colleges, the newspapers, the people—high and low. The personal reference, I think, help greatly to interest the reader in all the matter contained between the two covers; Lieutenant Governor Dundas and Hatch, the town crier; John Lepage the poet and Alex. the keeper. Noah's Ark, all beautifully blended into a surprising story of life in the old town.
