REPORT OF GRAND SCRIBES . O . T .

(Continued From Page One.) Kensington, April 26th, 1910.

G. W. P. and Representatives:

Just one year and a half ago since we last met with the brethren of the Shamrock Division the occasion being the Diamond Jubilee of the Order of the Sons of Temperance for this province, an event long to be remembered in the history of our Noble Order.

Today we are again meeting under circumstances and conditions as favorable as then with hopes, aspirations and aims as high as at any period of our history. As a Grand Division we hold a proud and honorable position among the sister Grand Divisions of our National Jurisdiction. The respect in which we are held by our highest officer, The Most Worthy Patriarch J. O. McCarthy should stimulate us to put forth our best efforts to maintain our high standard, and give every attention to the propagation of the Order within our bounds.

The past quarter has been one of much activity among all the subordinate divisions in working order. In many cases the interest and enthusiasm displayed has been remarkable. We could only hope that the same degree of success would continue during the next quarter.

Refuge Division, No. 201 Fredericton still holds the proud name of banner with a memo of 146 the highest memo ever held in the history of this Division. Highland Division No. 265 Hartsville is a close second with a memo of 143. This Division is apparently heading for leadership, and if Scotch blood and energy counts for anything she may yet succeed in her worthy purpose. But alas! Refuge has many seers under its shelter who may yet come to their assistance in maintaining the position she has so worthily held for many quarters.

Aurora Division, Sackville, has done splendidly during the past quarter having made a gain of 11 the highest gain made in the jurisdiction. Union Division, No. 45 Springfield, has made a gain of 10 since we met with them in January. But suspensions are again to the front and laid hands on Try Again Division Bonshaw suspending 35 for non-payment of dues. Twentieth Century, York has suspended 14, Shamrock Division Kensington 10. This being a fatal epidemic in our ranks I shall not take up precious time discussing remedies, suffice to say the financial scribes must be more exacting and alert in collecting dues.

We are pleased to report the organization of two new divisions. Springfield Division No. 271 at Springfield Lot 8 and Western Star No. 272 at Glenwood both of whom were organized by P. G. W. P. Rev. E. S. Weeks.

Brethren: I have come to the conclusion that we must get an organizer for at least three weeks during the coming summer. There are many places where I feel confident that a new division could be started. There are places where some could be re-organized or a new division started in its stead. Let me here mention a few places where our Order should be planted. Hamilton, Bloomfield, Cavendish, St. Eleanors, Argyle, Shere, Augustine Cove, Coleman, North Bedeque, Milton, Covehead. There are many of us who can talk, talk, talk, but the time has come when we must do, do, do, something. I trust that the Committee on the State of the Order may give the matter some thought. We are pleased to note that the proposed prohibition bill for the province of Nova Scotia has passed both Houses of the Nova Scotia Legislature. The liquor men had proposed several amendments to the Bill but they were voted down, with our good brethren, the temperance people we heartily rejoice with them in the victory won toward the suppression of the drink traffic.

DEFEAT OF IMPORTATION BILL. Many of our temperance people will learn with profound regret of the unexpected defeat of the Bill to stop liquor shipments into this Province. The following clipping from the Charlottetown Guardian of the 23rd ult, explains briefly the situation:

THE BILL TO STOP LIQUOR SHIPMENTS.

Many of our good temperance people were interested in the bill, promoted by the Hon. Mr. Allaire, here and introduced by Sir Richard Scott in the Senate, to prevent shipments of liquor from outside points into prohibited districts like Prince Edward Island. This bill had passed its second reading in the Senate and was expected to pass that House all right, whatever fate might await it in the House of Commons later. It was, however, killed in the Senate in committee of the whole House.

The blow came from an unexpected quarter. Hon. George W. Ross, ex-Premier of Ontario, has long posed as a supporter of prohibition. He was one of the men confidently counted upon to help the present bill along. On the contrary he took the ground that the Province had the power to protect itself and therefore ought not to seek legislation at Ottawa in this matter. With Senator Ross' influence thrown against it the bill was defeated.

Whether or not the Province has the power which Senator Ross says it has may be open to question. The power of the Dominion Parliament is undoubted and ought to have been exercised to afford this community the same protection as is given to the counties and cities that are under the Scott Act. Doubts as to the power of the Provincial Legislature to prohibit the carriage of liquor on the P. E. Island Railway and the Steam Navigation Company's boats, or to punish those carriers for transporting liquor, arise from the fact that the railway is the property of the Dominion and the Navigation Company has a Federal charter. Still it may be well to try what the Legislature can do now that the Ottawa Parliament has proved so disappointing. The restriction asked for is so

just, reasonable and so supported by legislation enacted and in force, that in the end it must be applied here. The fight must go on till the victory is won.

We understand from this that the legislature of the Island is within its constitutional rights in passing a law prohibiting absolutely the importing of intoxicating liquors into the province. If landed here it could then be seized by officers of the law.

This being the end of the official year of the Report of our Order to the National Division, I shall here submit the statistical table for last year.

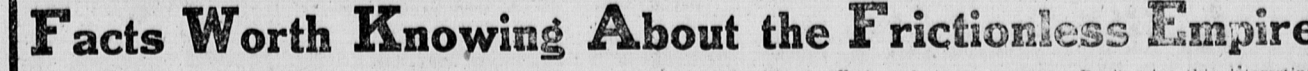
