not by any means a large gain, still considering the fact that the three previous years showed an average loss per year of 220, I consider it very encouraging, and the reports for the term ending June 30th, indicate that the revival of interest is being fairly well maintained.

Financially, the lodges are with a few exceptions in good condition, and during the year increased their cash assets by \$2,145.00 and their total assets by \$16,766.00. During the year 698 candidates were initiated and it is interesting to note that 162 were under 20 years of age, which will no doubt be gratifying to those who strongly advocated the reduction of the age limit from 21 to 18.

During the term ending June 30th last, 58 lodges show a total net gain of 315.

43 lodges show a total net loss of 322.

20 lodges show no change in membership, and 7 lodges have not reported.

Quite a number of the District Deputy Grand Masters report on the sale of application forms has been larger than for some time past, so it is hoped that the period of depression is pretty well over and that from now on our annual reports will show substantial gains in our membership.

The reports of the Rebekah Assembly show the number of Lodges to be 9 with a membership of 4,951. The total receipts were \$13,887.

The report of the Grand Treasurer, J. A. M. Donohue showed receipts of \$37,347 and a balance on hand of \$26,500. The report of the Grand Treasurer of the home fund (Mr. Donohue) showed receipts of \$6,431 and a balance over disbursements of \$4,884.

The receipts of maintenance of the Home was \$13,126 and the expenditure \$3,929.

**French Perfect Pilotless Steel-Nosed Plane**

LONDON, Aug. 12. - A pilotless radio-controlled air ship is said to be the latest deadly weapon of war which France is preparing for use against her possible enemies of the future.

This steel-nosed airplane is said to have been demonstrated successfully at Cherbourg and to have given promise that it might in time of war dash straight at a formation of enemy airmen, wrecking havoc in their planes. British air-service officials are intensely interested in the reports of the new death-dealing device, for they realize that if it is perfected, it will have with it the advantages of the dirigible, the dirigible being the only aircraft capable of being assembled for an attack on the enemy. Driving squarely at the heart of an enemy formation, the new planes would cause collision and disaster. According to the military authorities, a "ram" attack would be followed by pursuit of disorganized enemy planes. Disorganized by a mass attack, the enemy machines would easily fall prey to the pursuing force and their pilots would be picked off one by one.

**Suggests Cure For Nova Scotia's Economic ills**

(Canadian Press)

HALIFAX, N. S., Aug. 12. - A casting of the British North American act to the end that Nova Scotia be permitted to make her own trade treaties, control her own tariff policies and to exercise full control of her fisheries and fishing, is suggested today by a disolution of the present partnership, in order that Nova Scotia may become again a self-governing, self-respecting, self-supporting unit in the British Commonwealth.

Two alternatives to the present situation held out today by Clifford L. Baker, on behalf of the League for the Economic Independence of Nova Scotia, before the Royal Commission investigating the claims of the Maritime Provinces with respect to Confederation.

Closely questioned by the chairman, Sir Andrew Rae Duncan, the remedies for the economic ills of the province could be found within the confederation they would be preferable to remedies based on a dissolution of the partnership.

**THE MARKETS**

MONTREAL, Que., Aug. 12. - Extreme dullness marked the export trade in Canadian grades of grain on the Montreal market today. The country trade in all lots of grain was also slow, but the undertone to the market was about steady at the late reduction in prices noted. Owing to the fact both foreign and local buyers were holding off with the expectation of lower prices in the near future. The trade in spring wheat was quiet but there were unchanged prices.

The winter wheat situation was without any new feature to note, business was quiet and prices were at the recent advance on prices noted. A fair volume of business was transacted in millfeed and the feeling was steady. The demand for standard grades of rolled oats was again light, but prices were unchanged. The demand for eggs of late has been confined to small quantities owing to the warm weather prevailing. Prices were well maintained, fresh extras were offered at 40 cents and firsts at 34 cents per dozen. The receipts were 1,604 cases. An easier feeling prevailed in the butter trade, but prices did not show any change. No. 1 pasteurized was offered at 32 3/4 to 33 cents per pound with few takers. The receipts were 2,100 packages. The undertone in the cheese market was softer and prices were shaded. Western grades sold at 17 1/2 cents to 17 1/4 cents per pound, and eastern grades at 16 3/4 cents per pound. The receipts were 1,577 boxes.

**BIG SHIPMENT OF GOLD TO CANADA**

NEW YORK, Aug. 12. - A shipment of \$1,000,000 of gold to Canada was announced yesterday by the Bank of Montreal, a continuation of the movement that started about two weeks ago in response to the strong premium in Canadian exchange. The Canadian dollar was quoted yesterday at a premium of 2 of one per cent which is the level at which the bulk of the recent shipments were made. A total of \$5,500,000 of gold has been shipped to Canada since the beginning of the present movement.

**Special Duties On Flour May Be Repealed**

(Special to the Guardian)

LONDON, Aug. 12. - The commercial committee of the German Reichstag, in session in Berlin on Saturday, discussed the advisability of repealing the special tariffs on flour inaugurated on August 1st, which fix the duty on flour at ten marks and on oats products at fourteen marks.

It is understood that the industrialists urged the repeal of these duties chiefly for the purpose of bringing pressure to bear on Canada to force her to conclude a commercial agreement with Germany.

It is pointed out that repeal will permit differentiation in favor of the countries who are willing to conclude or have concluded such agreements with Germany and in this way Canada will have to meet competition from her rivals in the matter of higher duties on grain as well as other wheat products.
