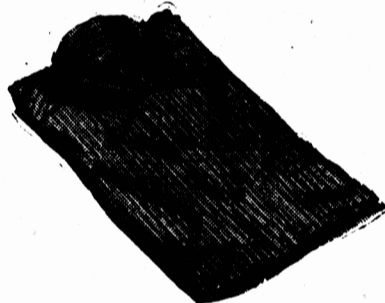

Canada Watches U. S. Foreign Aid Developments

(By Douglas How) OTTAWA, June 14—(CP)—Officials linked with Canada's role under the European Recovery plan are watching United States congressional gyrations and Anglo-American negotiations with a vital concern. The gloom that accompanied a severe 25 per cent slash in monetary appropriations by the U. S. House of Representatives has been replaced by a cautious glee during the week-end action of a Senate committee in restoring most of it.

the Economic Co-operation Administration amount to \$58,548,900. This accounts for all but \$18,719,000 of the total off-shore purchase authorizations to date, indicating that so far slightly more than 75 per cent of procurement of aid commodities outside the United States is being placed in Canada. Total authorizations for procurement in the United States and elsewhere have reached \$364,565,681, for Europe, and additional authorizations of aid to China and Trieste bring the total to \$393,737,029.

the aid-Europe program \$4,000,000. (This is in addition to \$1,055,000,000 already received for the European Recovery Program.) For Government and relief in occupied areas, \$1,325,000,000; this sum includes \$125,000,000 for aid to Japan and Korea to be handled by E. C. A. Aid to China \$460,000,000. This includes \$125,000,000 earmarked for grants and aid solely for military purposes. Greek-Turkish aid \$250,000,000. International children's emergency fund \$20,000,000. International refugee organization \$10,700,000.
