Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at another person, daughter, brother or sister, or a homesteader in good standing. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section also. Price \$10 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his home-land right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$20 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

PROVINCIALIST HAS NARROW ESCAPE.

The Lynn, Mass., item contains the following account of the wonderful escape from death of James McLeod, formerly of Hampshire, in this Province—Rubber boots prevented the electrocution of James McLeod of 370 Westmore Avenue at the river works of the General Electric Co. Sunday night. Forty-five hundred volts of electricity almost twice as much current as is employed in electrocutions at the Charlottetown State prison, would have caused instantaneous death but for the good fortune of McLeod in having his feet protected by rubber boots.

Although he was completely paralyzed for some time after his forehead touched against the bottom of a powerful arc lamp, prompt medical treatment administered by Dr. George H. Kirkpatrick, followed by continuation of the treatment at the Lynn Hospital, restored McLeod to consciousness and brought back the use of his faculties.

McLeod was working about a big electric crane and was in a stooping position, when he stood up just in time to have his forehead come in contact with the arc lamp. He uttered a sharp cry as he fell unconscious to the floor of the crane, and in an instant several other workmen were at his side.
