## \$150,000 FIRE AT ND ON, ONT.

The Canadian Packing Company's Plant Destroyed. Covered by Insurance.

LONDON, August 21.—Fire broke out in the east sheds of the Canadian Packing company's plant at Pottersburg, yesterday afternoon at 1.30 and by 2 o'clock the whole plant was practically destroyed. The Canadian Packing company was established here about 20 years ago at the instance of Sir John Carling, who was then minister of agriculture. Danish and English capital was largely interested in the venture. The company prospered and the plant just destroyed was one of the most up-to-date in Canada. The loss is about \$150,000, covered by insurance.

## HEAVY FIRE IN NEW ORLEANS

Conflagration That Sweeps Away Property Valued at Between One and Two Millions.

NEW ORLEANS, August 30. Fire in the centre of the commercial district this afternoon swept over portions of three blocks, destroying a large number of wholesale houses, manufacturing plants and small stores. Originally at Bienville and Charles streets, the flames worked their way north as far as Centre street and went toward Royal, causing a loss of between one and two million dollars. At the time the alarm was turned in, shortly before three o'clock, the firemen were in the midst of their annual picnic at a suburban park and engines and patrols responded with a mere handful of men. When the picnickers finally reached the scene it was even then impossible to make a successful stop of the flames owing to an inadequate supply of water. The fire was one of the most spectacular in recent years. Two warehouses filled with wines and liquors were among the buildings destroyed. As they burned the barrels of whiskey and brandy exploded with roars which could be heard three blocks and which shook the walls of adjoining buildings and endangered the lives of the firemen engaged in fighting the flames.

## GIGANTIC OAT IN ENGLAND.

LONDON, August 29. — The following is a clipping from an English newspaper and may be of interest to some. There is growing in Lancashire on Garton's soil plants which surpasses by several hundred points any cereal ever produced in the world. The single head contains a few short of 1,000 grains, ten times as many as you will find in the best crops. The plant is a more or less accidental result of the original system of what may be called accelerated evolution, which has been practised on these grounds for the last twenty-seven years.

This particular prodigy has been obtained by crossing highly developed oats with the wild oat, which has an enormous capacity for bearing seeds. These are small and useless, but the strange fact has been discovered that the wild oat man in crossing even enlarge the grain of the cross, as well as increase its number. This particular oat is but an extreme instance of the law production in cereals of all sorts. It is an indisputable fact, though practical farmers will have difficulty in believing it, that on these grounds oat crops of 160 bushels of the acre—that is, twice the weight of a high average of present crops—have been reaped without any artificial manure or any intensive cultivation.

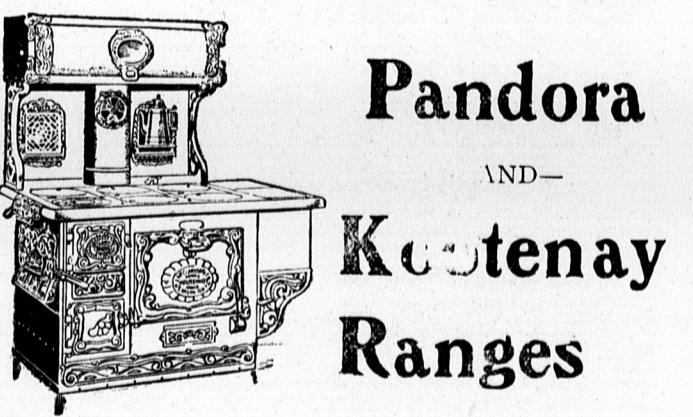
