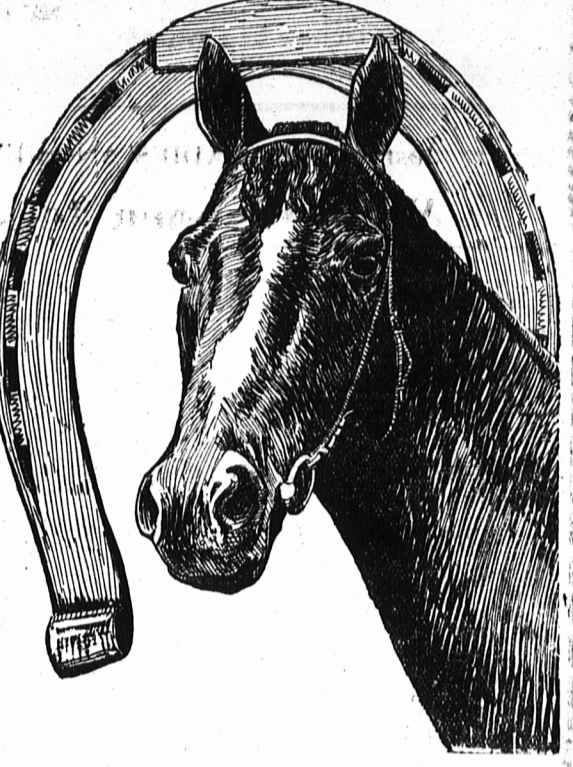

Heiress Says Uncle Misused \$5,000,000

Seeks Removal of Administrator of Estate

RIVERHEAD, L. I., Nov 17—Mrs Robert B. Honeyman, jr., daughter of the late John K. Stewart, founder of the Stewart Manufacturing Company and the Stewart-Warner Speedometer Corporation of Chicago, in the Surrogate's Court today asked the removal of her uncle, Leander H. LeChance, of Chicago, as administrator of her father's estate. She also opposed the appointment of her uncle and Martin Taylor, a New York attorney, as administrators of the estate of her 10-year-old sister, Jean, who died on Oct. 10.

Mrs. Honeyman, who is 19 years old, charged in the papers filed by her father-in-law, Robert B. Honeyman, a lawyer, that her uncle and Mr. Taylor had mismanaged the estate to their own advantage and that her uncle had caused himself to be elected president of the Stewart Manufacturing Company and chairman of the Stewart-Warner Speedometer Corporation.

She alleged that when her father died on June 1, 1916, that he left an estate appraised at \$5,257,343 to be divided equally among his widow and their two children, Mrs. Julia B. Stewart, the widow, died

within a year of his death, and on March 23, 1917 Justice Strong of the Supreme Court, then Surrogate of Suffolk county, appointed Mr. LeChance as guardian of the two children and administrator.

Mrs. Honeyman charged that her uncle had acquired from the estate 750 shares of the Stewart Manufacturing Company and 11,000 shares of the Stewart-Warner Speedometer Corporation, and had purchased the stock of the Stewart Manufacturing Company from the estate "at a price less than the real value" and "caused himself to be elected president of the corporation at a large salary, and has since received large gains and profits to the detriment of the estate and in violation of his duty as guardian and protector of the interests of your petitioner."

The petitioner also referred to a final report on the estate filed by her uncle, and alleged that the report charged excessive sums as paid for the maintenance of Mrs. Honeyman and her deceased sister. She said that the accounting showed \$350,000 in counsel fees and commissions and been paid by her uncle exclusive of other commissions. She alleged that a large part of the legal fees went to the firm of attorneys of which Taylor formerly was a member in New York.

The petition indicated that on Dec. 31, 1920, Mrs. Honeyman's share in the estate was put at \$2,283,586.04, and that of her sister Jean, \$2,310,512.24.

usually, do not give as good results as milk.

Calves still less milk if they are fed in stanchions. Time may be saved by this method of feeding. Keeping the calves in the stanchion for a short time after feeding tends to prevent their sucking from another. This is a very undesirable habit and one that may cause injury to the calves.

Full calving usually results in a better calf in that spring calving. The fall calf is fed milk or a substitute all winter and is turned on to the grass in the spring ready to make the best use of the pasture. The spring calf is fed milk all summer and turned on to dry feed in the fall. The fall calf consequently usually market better and more economical gains.

To raise a calf successfully it is necessary to remember constantly that the calf requires cleanliness, regularity and freedom from over-feeding.

There is considerable evidence that infection of females with

abortion bacilli most frequent occurs after conception and a measure that will lessen the chances of post conception infection materially reduces the number of abortions in the herd. The solution of all aborting and parturient cows in maternity stalls and individual paddocks until normal discharges from the reproductive organs have ceased, the avoidance of carrying these discharges in the feet of attendants to the barn floor with the daily use of a good disinfectant in the pails will greatly lessen the danger to pregnant cattle.
