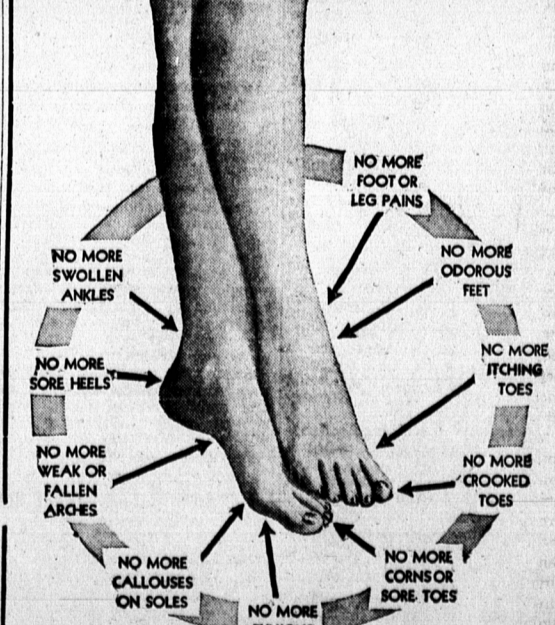
Irregular Trend On Mt'l. Mart
