There were 260 bags oats and potatoes among the shipments by the Empress Saturday morning.

Dealers in Summerside were paying from sixteen to eighteen cents per lb for butter last Friday.

Chas. R. Rogers, Summerside, and James Cushing, Moncton, were passengers by the Empress to Summerside Saturday.

The Victoria Hotel, Summerside, was offered for sale on Saturday last but was withdrawn by the owner, at the bid of \$2,000. The lot between the Pioneer building and Compton's buildings on Central Street, Summerside was bid in by H. A. Compton for 235 dollars.

Tomorrow (Tuesday) evening the three act comedy, All Tangled Up, will be presented by the Innis Falls Dramatic Club of Summerside in Kinkora Hall and a special train will leave Summerside for Kinkora at 6.15 p. m. returning after the show.

The S. S. Campana from Montreal on her first trip this season arrived in Summerside yesterday morning. After discharging a very heavy cargo she left about daylight for Charlottetown and Pictou, and will be due in Summerside on return to Montreal tomorrow. Tuesday evening with the exception of the Empress the Campana was the first entry at the customs at Summerside this season.

PROVINCIALISTS GONE TO OTTAWA

A delegation from Prince Edward Island, namely, Premier Heward, Hon. John Richards, Minister of Agriculture, and Hon. Joseph Read, passed through the city Friday for Ottawa, where they will interview the Dominion Cabinet at Ottawa on some very important matters affecting the interests of that Province. Among those may be mentioned the Island claim, an elaborate memorial of which was presented by Mr. Heward in the closing days of our Provincial Legislature. These claims have been set forth with great minuteness and at considerable length. Mr. Richards will deal with agricultural interests and lay before the Dominion Government what it is considered should be done by the Department of Agriculture to forward agricultural affairs in the Island Province. Captain Read represents the Summerside Board of Trade, and will deal with matters affecting the shipping and transportation facilities of the western part of the Island. Moncton Transcript.

PRUNING TREES

This is the best time to prune apple trees. The light frost will not injure the cells of the wood where the branches have been removed. All dead or decayed branches should be taken off, also all that are crossing or rubbing against one another. Where the growth last year has been excessive it should be cut back or else the trees will switch in the wind and be more liable to damage. Again if they are well cut back the fruit will form on the larger limbs and the apples will stay better on the trees. In removing large limbs two cuts should be made so that no splitting or peeling of the bark will take place. The last cut should be made as close to the main branch or body of the tree as possible, so that it may heal quickly. Paint all wounds over one inch in diameter. The object of pruning is to thin out the trees and to have the fruit buds evenly distributed over the larger branches. The Co-operative Fruit Company is securing the best literature available for its members. Every fruit grower should become a member.
