HORSE NOTES.—In another column of this issue will be found the advertisement of Beau Gallant, owned by W. S. The dam of Beau Gallant is Directress, 2,19, by Director. Directress is also the dam of Fenella, 2,13 and Fenella is the dam of Todd and Sadie Mack, 2,11, the two fastest trotters the world ever saw. Sadie Mack is the unbeaten three-year-old of 1903, won in four stake races \$18,500, and afterwards sold for \$20,000. She is picked as a two-minute prospect for 1904. Beau Gallant is three year old this spring. He is a beautiful dapple bay, strong at every point, disposition perfect, a remarkably handsome horse, excellent style and action.

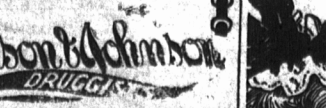
