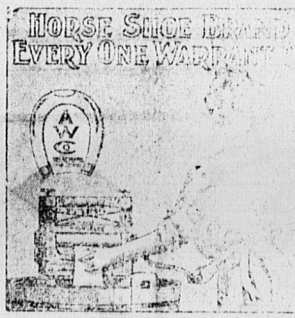

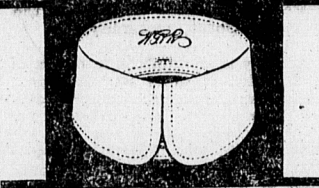

ST. JOHN, March 29—The Methodist clergymen held their regular weekly meeting in Centenary church recently. Rev. Charles Combe presided. Porto Rico 38 1/2, vices in Exmouth street church. Rev.
