The manager for the Provincial seed Fair met at the Victoria Hotel Summerside on Saturday. The chairman James Carruthers presided. There were present also Rev. J. A. McDonald, R. H. McDonald, P. J. Humphrey, Prof. Ross and L. U. Fowler. It was decided to hold the seed fair on Wednesday and Thursday, March 18th and 19th next. Circulars were prepared for distribution among the farmers of P. E. I. and the seedmen of the Maritime Provinces. The prize list of last year was revised and extended and departments of household service added, in which 35 prizes are offered for competition. It was decided to ask the Farmers' institutes and others to contribute to the general prize list. The committee was assured that the town of Summerside would give every encouragement to make the fair a greater success, even than last year. It was resolved that the committee heartily approve of the action of the Department of Agriculture in offering to pay the transportation charges of Island grain and seeds to and from Amherst entered for competition at the Amherst Fair to be held Dec. 2 to 4 if delivered at the Steam Navigation Company's wharf in Charlottetown by Thursday, Nov. 28 or at the Company's wharf in Summerside Friday the 29th. Committee adjourned to meet in December.

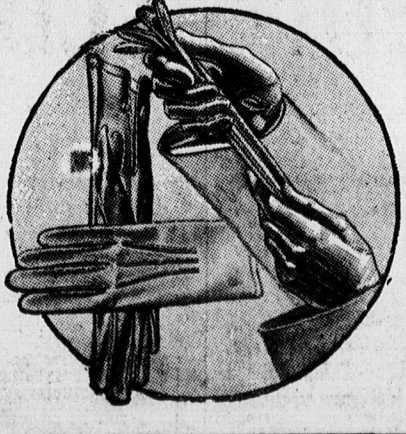
