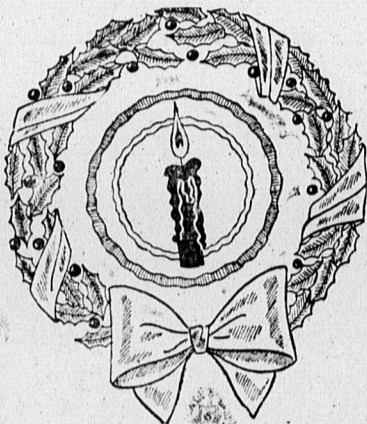

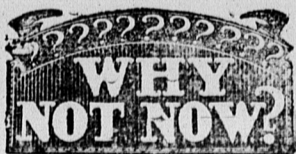

## Conference Of Newsprint Manufacturers

NEW YORK, N. Y., Dec. 21—The conference between Canadian newsprint manufacturers for a merger of their properties, it has been suggested that a consolidation of the more important units would probably provide the best remedy for the present difficulties of the industry, says J. F. Fearing, vice-president and sales manager, in a letter to the company's customers in the United States.

"The recent conferences have been attended not only by the officials of our subsidiary, Canadian International Paper Company," he says, "but by the officials of other outstanding Canadian paper companies and by representatives of important Canadian banking interests. E. W. Beatty, president of the Canadian Pacific Railway, and one of the most public-spirited leaders of Canadian opinion, has also been present.

Mr. Fearing says it has been argued that no scheme for consolidation will be worthwhile unless the set-up is based on a conservative capitalization combined with the operation of the most efficient type of low-cost mills.

"Knowing that the industry today is suffering from the effect of low prices, greatly aggravated by low-operating ratios and that, with only a few exceptions, fixed charges are not being earned," he says, "it is realized that no consolidation would be of any value unless it could show very substantial savings. Such savings, it is felt, would be assured by running the most efficient units of capacity, while maintaining the fairly moderate ones on a lower scale and eliminating those with excessively high costs.

Premier R. B. Bennett returned to Ottawa from Toronto early yesterday and spent a busy day in his office. With Major W. D. Herridge, Canadian Minister at Washington, in Ottawa for the holidays, and the joint commission of engineers meeting in Buffalo today on the International Rapids section of the St. Lawrence deep waterways project, will no doubt be given much attention this week.

The report continues here, as previously stated, that it may be possible for Canada and United States to push forward negotiations to submit the proposals to parliament before the end of the coming session. The strong endorsement of Imperial preferences voiced by Hon. Joseph A. Lyons, Australia's prospective prime minister, in Melbourne today, is viewed here as promising for the success of the Imperial economic conference in Ottawa next summer. Australia had been pressing for the conference to meet at as early a date as possible, but with a new government taking over the reins of power, an early date may not suit its convenience.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 21.—With eventual ratification assured, the Hoover debt moratorium will face today in the Senate its last and most difficult congressional hurdle.

Leaders are hopeful of sending it to the White House by Tuesday, when Congress intends to recess for Christmas. However the one year postponement of intergovernmental debts already in effect faces opposition of undetermined strength from a band of critics headed by Senator Hiram Johnson, California Republican.

President Hoover obtained pledges of support from more than a majority of the Senate last summer before he proposed the debt holiday.

Republican leaders are anxious to get the question out of the way before the recess and have asked continuous sessions will be held beginning at noon today. Final action would clear the way for consideration immediately after the holidays of President Hoover's domestic economic program.

Johnson has announced he will not filibuster, but he and his supporters plan to develop at some length the dangers they believe are hidden behind the moratorium plan.

The pending deadlock over the election of a president pro tempore may present a parliamentary snag to speedy ratification of the moratorium.

The debate is expected to develop still further the already pronounced congressional opposition to President Hoover's recommendation for revival of the war debts commission.

The moratorium resolution came from the House with an amendment attached expressing the opposition of congress to revision or cancellation of the late war debts.

Opponents of the debt holiday contend it is the "opening wedge" to cancellation of the war debts due to the United States, which would throw the burden of the war upon tax payers in this country.

Some of them also claim its chief benefit has been to international bankers, rather than the people of the country as a whole.

In this connection, the Senate finance committee has been investigating the flotation of foreign securities in this country. This inquiry will, be resumed this morning.
