Centennial Celebration

The days of Sept. 15th-17th will be red-letter ones in the calendar of Princetown congregation when for those days they will entertain the Presbyterian Women's Missionary Society of the Maritime Provinces, and at the same time celebrate the centenary of the formation of the first Women's Missionary Society in Canada in connection with the Presbyterian church. This society that was founded in 1825 was called "The Princetown Female Society for Propagating the Gospel," and its organization consisted of patroness, secretary, treasurer, and an executive committee of four members. The delegates, who are expected will number upwards of 150, will arrive Tuesday morning and the program will open Wednesday morning and continue till Thursday evening. Many noted speakers and returned missionaries will take part. Among others will be Rev. Mr. Robb of Korea, Dr. Morton of Trinidad, Dr. F. M. Auld, of Havana, Mrs. McGilvray, President of the Western Division of Women's Missionary Societies and Dr. R. W. Ross of Halifax, will also take part. An item of special interest is set down for Wednesday evening when a tablet will be unveiled in the Princetown church in honor of this society. The tablet is placed there by the congregation who feel justly proud for the honour that falls to them in that the great work of the Presbyterian Women's Missionary Societies in Canada, so richly blessed by God, had its inception in the historic Princetown church. Great enthusiasm characterizes those who are heading up the work of entertaining, and the congregation is eagerly looking forward to next week as another milestone in its rich and noted history.
