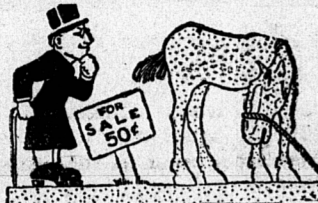

AGRICULTURAL MEETINGS.—There is no way by which the farmers of Prince Edward Island can increase their yield of grain so easily as through the use of good seed. Small seed may germinate, but it will produce defective plants, and if it is sown thick it will hurt rather than help the crop. Weed seeds are harmful, in that they may produce a crop that is in itself injurious; but their greatest harm lies in the fact that they occupy space where good crops should be growing. These and similar subjects will be discussed at the meetings held in connection with the seed fairs. On Wednesday afternoon Mr. T. A. Brennan will speak at Summerside on co-operation, particularly with reference to the circle movement, while Mr. R. H. Campbell, Superintendent of Education, will speak on the work that is being done in the schools. On Wednesday evening an agricultural conference will be held at which the importance of increased production to the Allies will be the subject. On Thursday forenoon the ladies will occupy the hall. A general public meeting will be held in the evening and will be addressed by Premier Mathieson, Rev. Dr. Gauthier, Hon. Murdock McKinnon, Rev. J. C. Martin of Cardigan and others.
